



July - The Most Precious Blood of our Lord

The Blood of Christ is precious because it is Christ's own great ransom paid for the redemption of mankind. As there was to be no remission of sin without the shedding of blood, the Incarnate Word offered his life for the salvation of the world. The devotion to the Most Precious Blood is a call to repentance and reparation.

# July 3 - St. Thomas the Apostle

On Christ's second apparition, Thomas was furnished with the evidence he had demanded - seeing in Christ's hands the point of the nails. Thomas even put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand into Christ's side. After verifying the wounds were real, St. Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus.

# July 11 - St. Benedict

St. Benedict is known as the Father of Western Monasticism and honored as the Patron of Europe. He lived from 480 a.d. to 547 a.d. St. Benedict's order truly has changed the world. Because of these monks, virtually every ancient text that survived to the eighth century has survived to date.

# July 16 - Our Lady of Mount Carmel

In 1251 St. Simon Stock experienced a vision of the Virgin Mary, who presented Simon with the brown scapular. The brown scapular quickly became a widely recognized symbol of devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel. It represents a covenant between the wearer and Mary, who pledges her maternal care.

# July 25 - St. James the Apostle

St. James was one of Jesus' first disciples and the brother of John the apostle. James was one of only three called by Jesus to witness his Transfiguration. Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Word in Spain. On his return to Jerusalem, he was martyred by King Herod. Saint James the Greater is known as the first apostle to die.

# July 31 - St. Ignatius

St. Ignatius of Loyola is known for founding the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits, as well as for creating the "Spiritual Exercises" often used today for retreats and individual discernment. Born into a noble Spanish family, Ignatius became a soldier. He was wounded in the leg during the siege of Pamplona in 1521. During his recuperation, he read "Lives of the Saints." The experience led him to a profound conversion, and he dedicated himself to the life of faith. While many held him in contempt because of his holy lifestyle, his wisdom and virtue attracted some followers, and the Society of Jesus was born.
