St. Joseph Catholic Church is honored to host the Carlo Acutis Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition, a powerful and inspiring event open to all area parishes and the general public. The exhibit is based on the work of Blessed Carlo Acutis, a teenager whose deep devotion to the Eucharist led him to document miracles from around the

world before his death in 2006.

This special version of the exhibit features an audio-visual guide that will walk visitors through the panels, bringing the stories to life. Guests are encouraged to bring a mobile device and/or headphones to access the guide during their visit. All display panels are presented in both English and Spanish.

The exhibition includes several Eucharistic Miracles throughout the Church's history - extraordinary events, approved by the Church, that reaffirm belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

## September 5 - Saint Teresa of Calcutta

St. Teresa of Calcutta, better known as Mother Teresa, spent a majority of her life helping the people of Calcutta, India. She was a nun, missionary, and the founder of the Missionaries of Charity. Originally a member of the Sisters of Loreto, she started her own ministry after traveling to Darjeeling and and seeing the plight of the poor. In 1950 she received Vatican permission for the Missionaries of Charity with their main goal being to take care of the poor and the sick. She quickly grew her order into an international organization and expanded the scope of their ministry. Although she passed away in 1997, she left behind a lasting legacy. Her order has grown to more than 5,000 religious sisters and they are present in 139 countries.

## September 8 - The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On September 8 each year, the Catholic Church celebrates one of its most ancient and beloved Marian feasts: the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This sacred day invites us to contemplate the humble beginning of she who would become the Mother of God, and to recognize how God's plan of salvation unfolds through the most ordinary and extraordinary moments of human life. The celebration of Mary's birth reaches back to the earliest centuries of Christianity. Historical records show that this feast was already being observed in the Eastern Church by the 5th century. The enduring nature of this celebration speaks to the deep reverence Christians have always held for Mary's role in the mystery of the Incarnation.

## September 12 - The Most Holy Name of Mary

The origins of the Feast of the Holy Name of Mary date back to the early 16th century. According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the feast was first instituted in 1513 in Cuenca, Spain. Initially, it was assigned to September 15, which is the octave day of the Nativity of the Virgin Mary. This connection reflects a deep association between the feast of Mary's birth and the reverence for her holy name. The significance of September 12 as the date for the Feast of the Holy Name of Mary took on a new dimension after the siege of Vienna in 1683. The victory of King John III Sobieski over the Ottoman Turks on this date was seen as a miraculous intervention attributed to the Virgin Mary's intercession. Pope Innocent XI extended the feast to the universal Church and designated it to be celebrated on the Sunday following the Nativity of Mary. This decision underscored the belief that Mary played a pivotal role in the victory and was a testament to her powerful intercessory role.

## September 15 - Our Lady of Sorrows

The Catholic feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is celebrated annually on September 15 in commemoration of seven sorrows that the Virgin Mary experienced in her life. These sorrows include the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the child Jesus in the temple,

the meeting of Jesus and Mary on the way to Calvary, the crucifixion, the taking down of the body of Jesus from the cross, and the burial of Jesus. Our Lady of Sorrows reminds Catholics that Mary is not just the mother of Jesus but also the mother of all believers, including you and me. She walks with us on our journey to God and understands our struggles and pains. When we turn to her in prayer, she intercedes for us and brings our petitions to God.

## September 23 - Saint Pio of Pietrelcina

Saint Pio was born on May 25, 1887 in Pietrelcina, Southern Italy. He was tutored privately until his entry to the novitiate of the Capuchin Friars at the age of 15. Of feeble health but strong will, with the help of grace, he completed the required studies and was ordained a priest in 1910. On September 20, 1918 the five wounds of our Lord's passion appeared on his body, making him the first stigmatized priest in the history of the Catholic Church. Countless persons were attracted to his confessional and many more received his saintly counsel and spiritual guidance through correspondence. His whole life was marked by long hours of prayer and continual austerity. His letters to his spiritual directors reveal the ineffable suffering, physical and spiritual, which accompanied him all through his life. They also reveal his deep union with God, his burning love for the Blessed Eucharist and Our Blessed Lady. Worn out by over half a century of intense suffering and constant apostolic activity in San Giovanni Rotondo, Saint Pio was called to his heavenly reward on September 23, 1968. After a public funeral, which attracted over 100,000 mourners, his body was entombed in the crypt of Our Lady of Grace Church. Increasing numbers flock to his tomb from all parts of the world and many testify to spiritual and temporal graces received.

## September 27 - Saint Vincent de Paul

Saint Vincent de Paul was a man of exceptional empathy who acted on that empathy, rather than just feeling it. He was an outstanding organizer who inspired many from every social class to follow him. He inspired seminarians, priests, men, women, the rich, poor, powerful, sick, and everyone else within his circle of influence. Just over 150 years later, Saint Vincent's ministry continued to inspire, leading to Frédéric Ozanam's founding of what is today known as the Saint Vincent de Paul Society, an international lay organization providing direct relief and compassion to the poor at local levels.

## September 29 - Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels

St. Michael, whose name means "Who is like God," was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. St. Gabriel, which means "Strength of God," announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. St. Raphael, meaning "Medicine of God," is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.
