Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem

As members of the Catholic Church, we are blessed to have so many “internal” organizations that are charity oriented and help our brothers and sisters who are in need: The Knights of Columbus, Columbiettes, Knights of Malta, and the Ancient Order of Hibernians to name a few. However, there is one Order that has been very active in past few years, due to the military conflict in the Holy Land, that most Catholics do not know they exist.

The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem (EOHSJ) is an organization that has been around for over nine hundred years. It was founded by a crusade leader named Godfry de Bouillon, who originally named the Order “Order of Canons of the Holy Sepulchre”, and they were armed guardians tasked to protect the Holy Sepulchre from Muslims. The Order’s name, as it is known today, came about in the mid-1800s under Pope Pius IX.

The Order’s mission is to help preserve Christianity in the Holy Land. Its prayers and financial support helps to sustain Holy Sites, churches, educational institutions, to include the Jerusalem School of Nursing, religious communities, and a hospital. It operates as a lay Order, under the protection of the Holy See, with approximately 30,000 members worldwide who actively support the Latin Patriarch, Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Archbishop of Jerusalem. Its mission has been more important recently because of the military conflict in the area. Unfortunately, the pilgrimages that helped with a major source of funding have been lost because of this conflict and not being able to visit where our Lord once walked.

Members of the Order consists of Knights, Dames, Bishops, Priests and Deacons who are under the direction of Cardinal Fernando Filoni, the Order’s Grand Master, located in Rome at the Holy See, Membership in the order is a very high honor that the Church confers upon its laity and clergy.
