



December 3 - Saint Francis Xavier

St. Francis Xavier was a 16th-century Jesuit missionary known for his passionate evangelism in Asia. Born in Spain, he traveled to India, Japan, and Southeast Asia, spreading Christianity and establishing missions. Canonized in 1622, he is the patron saint of missionaries, remembered for his commitment to faith and tireless missionary work.

December 8 - Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

"The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." (Pius IX, Ineffabilis Deus, 1854)

December 12 - Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe honors Mary's apparition to St. Juan Diego on Tepeyac Hill, Mexico, in 1531. She appeared as a mestiza woman, speaking Nahuatl, the language of the indigenous people, and requested a church to be built in her honor. Her image miraculously appeared on Juan Diego's tilma (cloak), an image that remains intact after nearly 500 years, defying scientific explanation.

On this day, Catholics:


- Celebrate Mary's role as Patroness of the Americas and the protector of the unborn.
- Honor her message of unity, compassion, and evangelization.
- Reflect on her maternal love and her call for conversion.
- Recognize her impact on evangelization, leading to the mass conversion of millions in the New World.

December 14 - Saint John of the Cross

St. John of the Cross (1542-1591) lived during the latter part of the 16th century, a time when Europe was experiencing significant religious upheaval. Across the continent, the Protestant Reformation was pressing for change, and the Roman Catholic Church responded with internal reforms and spiritual renewals. St. John of the Cross emerged as one of the key figures of this Catholic Reformation in Spain, bringing a contemplative and poetic perspective that profoundly affected the faithful of his day and has continued to shape Christian spirituality.

December 25 - The Nativity of the Lord

The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, the Birth of Jesus Christ, and the First Day in the Octave of Christmas. Throughout Advent the Church longed ardently for the coming of our Savior. Today she celebrates His birth with unrestrained joy. "The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us." The Son of God became man to give us a share in that divine life which is eternally His in the Blessed Trinity. Christmas time begins on December 24 with the first Vespers of the feast and ends on the feast of the Baptism of Christ. White vestments reappear in our churches as a sign of joy.






Family of the Month - The KofC are pleased to announce the Doiron Family as our Family of the Month. Ron, a retired Army






