The Holy Family

The Month of February is Dedicated to the Holy Family

February 2 - The Presentation of the Lord

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus (also celebrated as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, traditionally known as Candlemas), is a significant feast in the Catholic liturgical calendar. Celebrated annually on February 2nd, 40 days after Christmas, it commemorates three pivotal events from the life of Jesus and Mary: the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, Mary's ritual purification according to Mosaic Law, and the prophetic encounter with Simeon and Anna. More than just a historical remembrance, Candlemas is a vibrant celebration of light, purity, and consecration to God.

February 3 - Saint Blaise

Saint Blaise was a physician and bishop in the early Christian Church, believed to have lived in the 3rd century. He is widely venerated as the patron saint of throat ailments, thanks to a legendary event where he miraculously cured a boy choking on a fishbone. His compassion and healing abilities made him a revered figure, and over time, he became one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, a group of saints believed to intercede in times of trouble. Saint Blaise's feast day involves a traditional blessing of throats, symbolizing his role as a protector against ailments of the throat and the power of faith in overcoming challenges.

February 11 - Our Lady of Lourdes

On Feb. 11, the Catholic Church celebrates the liturgical memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, recalling a series of 18 appearances that the Blessed Virgin Mary made to a 14-year-old French peasant girl, Saint Bernadette Soubirous. The Marian apparitions began Feb. 11, 1858, ended July 16 that year and received the local bishop's approval after a four-year inquiry. Coming soon after the 1854 dogmatic definition of her Immaculate Conception, the Virgin Mary's appearances at Lourdes turned the town into a popular travel destination. Thousands of people say their medical conditions have been cured through pilgrimage, prayer and the water flowing from a spring to which Bernadette was directed by the Blessed Virgin. Experts have verified 69 cases of miraculous healing at Lourdes since 1862.

February 18 - Ash Wednesday

You might be wondering why we get ashes on our foreheads for Ash Wednesday. Throughout history, ashes have been a powerful outward symbol of interior repentance and spiritual awareness. The Early Christians used ashes to show repentance as well, but not just on Ash Wednesday. After going to confession, it was common for the priest to give the person ashes on their forehead. Catholics have been receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday since the time of St. Gregory the Great. In 1091, Pope Urban II encouraged the entire Church to use ashes on Ash Wednesday.

February 22 - The Chair of Saint Peter

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter. It brings to mind the mission of teacher and pastor conferred by Christ on Peter, and continued in an unbroken line down to the present Pope. We celebrate the unity of the Church, founded upon the Apostle, and renew our assent to the Magisterium of the Roman Pontiff, extended both to truths which are solemnly defined *ex cathedra*, and to all the acts of the ordinary Magisterium. The Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Rome has been celebrated from the early days of the Christian era on January 18, in commemoration of the day when Saint Peter held his first service in Rome.

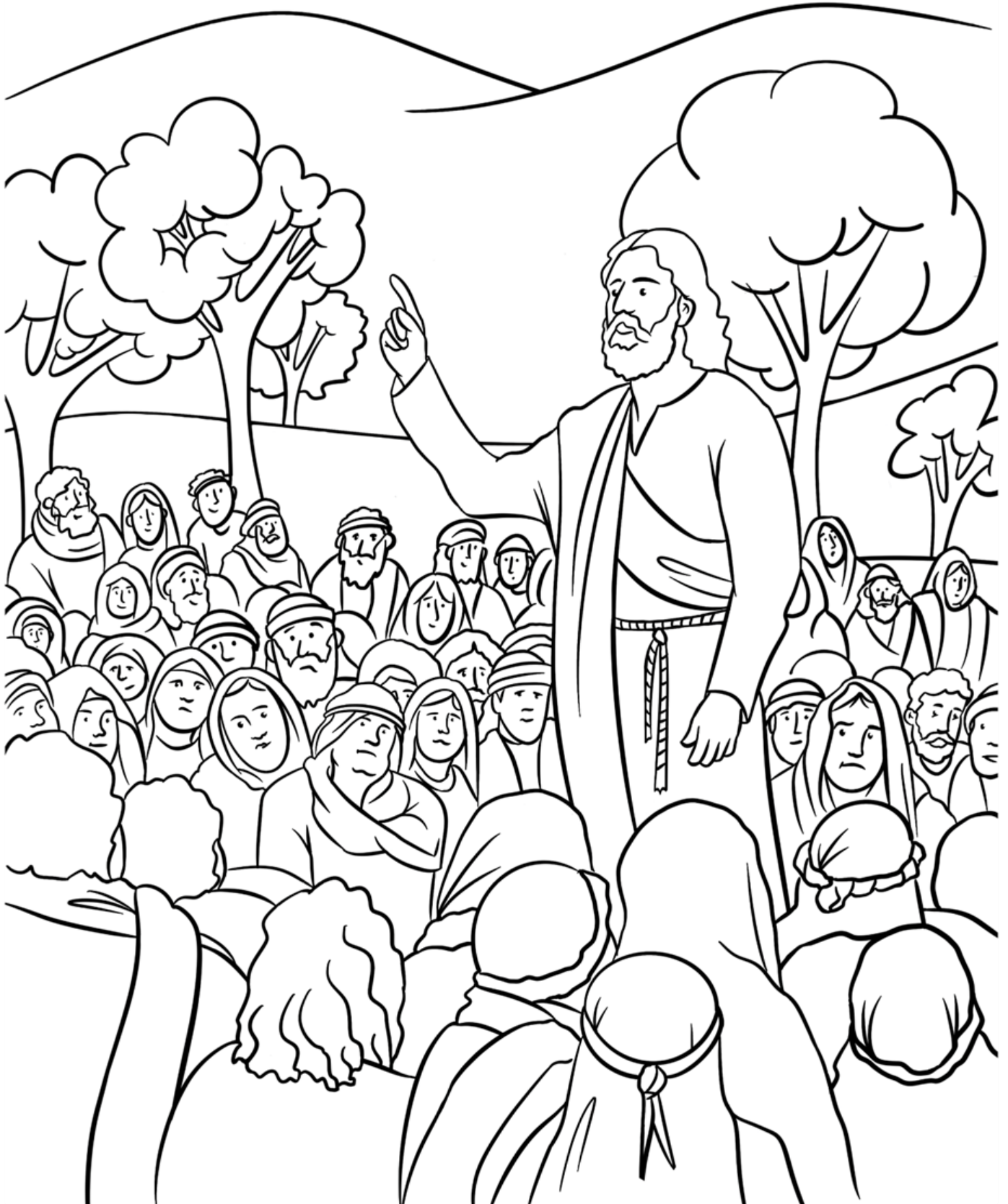

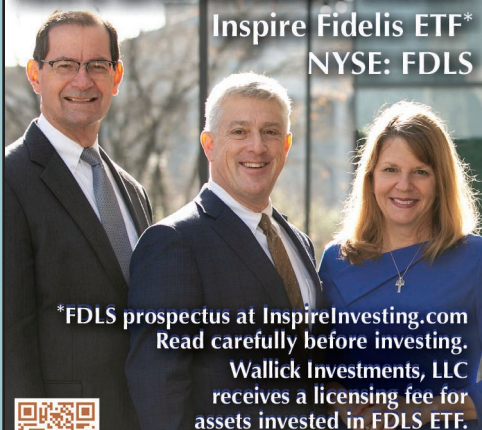
