

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the **Catholic Appeal of South Carolina**?

The Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (CASC) is a primary source of funding to help sustain and expand the ministries of the 96 parishes, 20 missions, 32 Catholic schools, and multiple ministries throughout the Diocese of Charleston and the state of South Carolina.

Can the funds raised by the Catholic Appeal be used for anything other than their stated purpose?

No! Donations to CASC are restricted for use to the stated ministries, programs, and Catholic education only. Your donations directly support and grow these missions — they **are not** to “keep the lights on at the Chancery.”

Does my gift make a difference, even if it’s small?

Yes! Each of us must discern what we can give in response to God’s generosity to us. All intentional gifts are acts of good stewardship and faith. Together, everyone in the diocese makes a tremendous difference — accomplishing far more than any one of us could on our own. Mother Teresa reminded us, “Not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love.”



Why should people give to the Appeal?

God bestows gifts and talents on us to spread his love and to love our neighbors as ourselves. We are stewards of these gifts that include our time, talent and financial resources. Jesus taught us, ‘Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me’ (*Mt 25:40*). Let’s go forth, together, as good stewards of God’s grace and support each another!

Why do we need these ministries & programs?

The ministries supported by the Appeal provide tangible ways to assist many in need, to support Catholic education and formation of young people, to provide seminary training for our future priests, and grow our charitable Catholic community. 



New Confirmation Schedule

When: **March 8th!** Due to the early Confirmation dates we have been assigned by the office of the Bishop, the 26/27 Confirmation Class will begin on March 8th with a Parent-Student meeting at 9:00 am in the Red Brick Building.

Who: Anyone who will start the 26/27 school year as a 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grader, and who has not been Confirmed is welcome to join in this new class.

How: Please fill out the form found on the round table in the Gathering Space to register your students for the new Confirmation preparation classes. **Registration forms are due by March 1st.** Copies of Baptism and First Communion Certificates are required if not already on file in the parish office.

Why: Beginning in March will allow your student to receive a full and unhurried education in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. We plan to have ten or so classes, take a summer break, and then return with the rest of Religious Education to complete the formation process.

Cost: \$30, which covers the cost of the 3 books that will be provided to your student and provides online access to the video segments if your child has to miss a class.


The ‘Angel Statue’ and ‘St. Patrick’s Statue’ recently installed in St. Patrick’s Catholic Cemetery located at 1201 Mason Road, Columbia, SC. The cemetery is very close to our parish. Directions from Transfiguration are south on Wilson Blvd (Hwy 21), cross Interstate 20, take the first right (past Pepsi plant and apartment complex) onto Mason Rd, St. Patrick’s Catholic Cemetery is approximately ¼ mile on the right.



Bishop Jacques Fabre-Jeune is planning to bless these two statues on Monday, March 9th, at 4PM.

A small reception, on site, is planned following the blessing and all are invited and encouraged to attend.

The Angel Statue proposal was initiated by the Knights and Columbiettes, Transfiguration Council 13713. The ‘Angel Statue’ is to serve and identify an area in St. Patrick’s where babies are buried and to provide an icon for all to pause and pray with their loved ones and those present. The inscriptions surrounding the statue were provided by Transfiguration Knights and Columbiettes members. The statue was purchased thru contributions



from Knights and Columbiettes Council 13713, Knights of Columbus Assembly (4th/Patriotic Degree) 2902, Knights of Columbus Council (St. John Neumann) 6847 and other contribution from members of parishes.

The St. Patrick’s Statue was initiated by the Diocese of Charleston and purchased thru donations of families who have loved ones interned in St. Patrick’s. The inscriptions are presented by the Diocese of Charleston. Both statues were installed by Diocese personnel and Knight of Columbus Council 13713.



