

Saint Joseph

March 17 – Saint Patrick of Ireland

St. Patrick is said to have been born around 389 AD in Britain. Captured by Irish raiders when he was around 16 years old, St. Patrick was taken as a slave to Ireland where he lived for six years as a shepherd before escaping and returning to his home. He was ordained a deacon in France around 418, ordained a bishop in 432 AD and then was assigned to minister to small, Christian communities in Ireland.

St. Patrick used his knowledge of Irish culture, gained during his years of captivity; using the traditions and symbols of the Celtic people, he explained Christianity in a way that made sense to the Irish. Although not the first, he is widely regarded as the most successful missionary to Ireland. His example laid the foundation for many Irish saints to follow. To this day, he continues to be revered as one of the most beloved Saints of Ireland.

March 19 – Feast of Saint Joseph

The primary feast of St. Joseph is March 19 because it is believed that his death occurred on that date. This feast was fixed in the 15th century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Gregory XV in 1621. Holy Mother Church dedicates the entire month of March to St. Joseph, as well as the First Wednesdays of the month (a devotion similar to the First Friday and First Saturday devotions).

March 25 – The Annunciation of the Lord

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord recalls the historical event of the Angel Gabriel appearing to the Virgin Mary, as found in Luke 1:26–38. It also celebrates the Church's faith in the underlying reality that took place at that moment in time—the Incarnation, making this solemnity not only a Marian solemnity, but first and foremost a Christological one. We also celebrate the Virgin Mary's perfect "Yes" to the plan of the Father. We celebrate her humility, obedience, docility, and especially her motherhood of God and man. Ask her to pray for you that you may imitate her "Yes" to the will of the Father in Heaven, so that you can continue to bring forth His divine Son in your soul, and so that He will be made manifest to the world through you.

March 29– Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war. A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter.


A small reception, on site will follow the blessing. All are invited and encouraged to attend!




