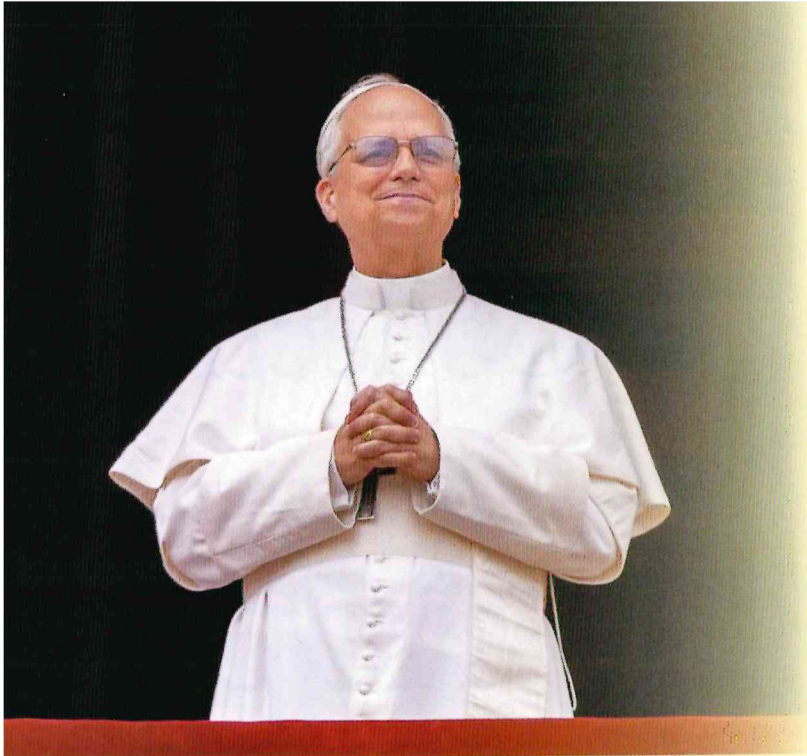

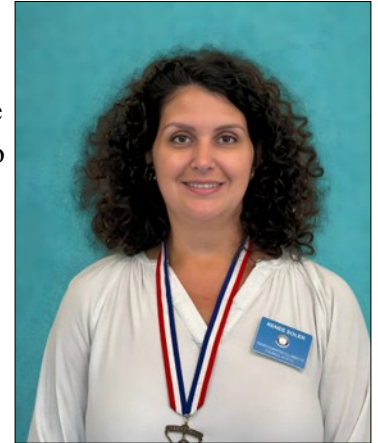

Columbiettes Enjoy an Afternoon of Fellowship and Fun

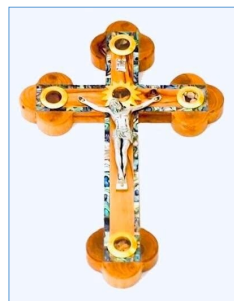

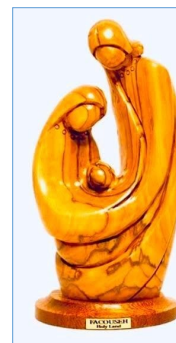

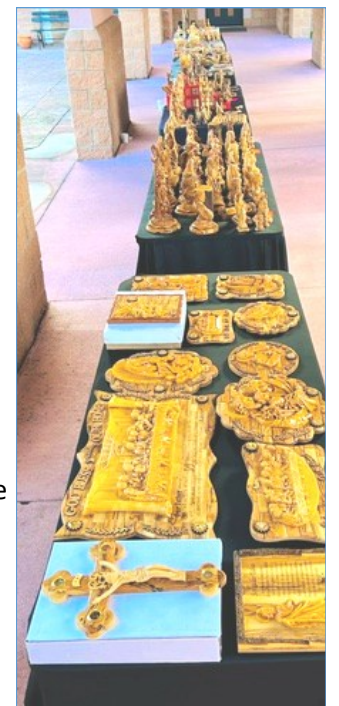
