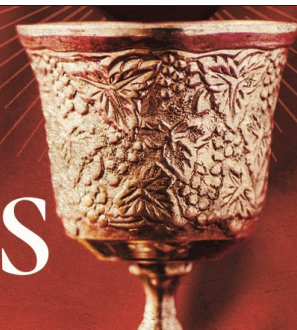

THE MONTH OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS



July 3 - St. Thomas, Apostle - St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas." Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas was gently rebuked for his skepticism and furnished with the evidence he had demanded - seeing in Christ's hands the point of the nails. Thomas even put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand into Christ's side. After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus.

July 11 - St. Benedict - Saint Benedict was known for his "Rule" which was a written set of guidelines for humble Christian existence. The Rule became the foundation for monastic life over the centuries and most of monastic life as we know it today owes its formation to the Rule of Saint Benedict. During the latter part of the fifth and early part of the sixth century, Saint Benedict began something that lives on to this day and will continue to do so. Monasteries like the ones founded by Saint Benedict, became the basis for the systems of hospitals, higher education and banking that we know today

July 16 - Our Lady of Mount Carmel - The brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, according to the Carmelite tradition, was presented by Our Lady to St. Simon Stock, the then Father General on July 16, 1251. Our Lady gave St. Simon a scapular for the Carmelites with the following promise, saying, "Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace." Mary promised that whoever died in it would not suffer everlasting punishment and would quickly be released from purgatory (Sabbatine privilege). According to some scholars it has become one of the most widely practiced Marian devotions.

July 22 - St. Mary Magdalene - St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels. It's often believed that Mary Magdalene was a prostitute or sexually immoral, but this is not supported in the scriptures. Research suggests that she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did. The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her. After this, she told several women whom she associated with and these women also became followers.

July 29 - Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus - We know that the Lord loved both Lazarus and his sisters Martha and Mary. And Mary, as we know, anointed Christ's feet with precious myrrh, thus performing an act of love and making a special preparation for the Savior for His burial. Why did the Lord love Martha and Mary and Lazarus? For the purity of their souls, of course; for their faith in Him.

Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, you befriended Jesus as your Lord and God, and as the Son of Man, to Whom you opened your home and lives. Please pray that I will open the home of my soul so as to befriend Him Who is my God and is the Resurrection and the Life.

July 31 - St. Ignatius - The Spanish saint is known for founding the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits, as well as for creating the "Spiritual Exercises" often used today for retreats and individual discernment. St. Ignatius was born into a noble family in 1491 in Guipuzcoa, Spain. He served as a page in the Spanish court of Ferdinand and Isabella. He then became a soldier in the Spanish army and wounded his leg during the siege of Pamplona in 1521. During his recuperation, he read "Lives of the Saints." The experience led him to undergo a profound conversion, and he dedicated himself to the Catholic faith. As the patron saint of soldiers, especially Catholic soldiers, he serves both as an intercessor for protection and safety in the face of danger and also as a reminder for every soldier that our true mission is to serve God.

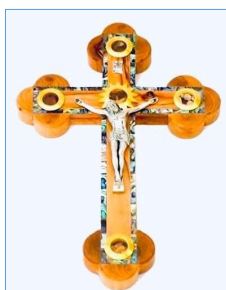

Olive Wood Art & Crafts from the Holy Land **Saturday, July 11th & Sunday, July 12th**

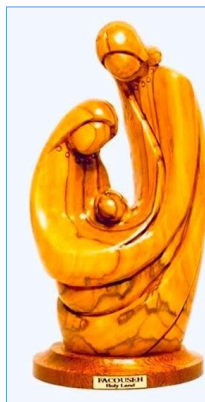

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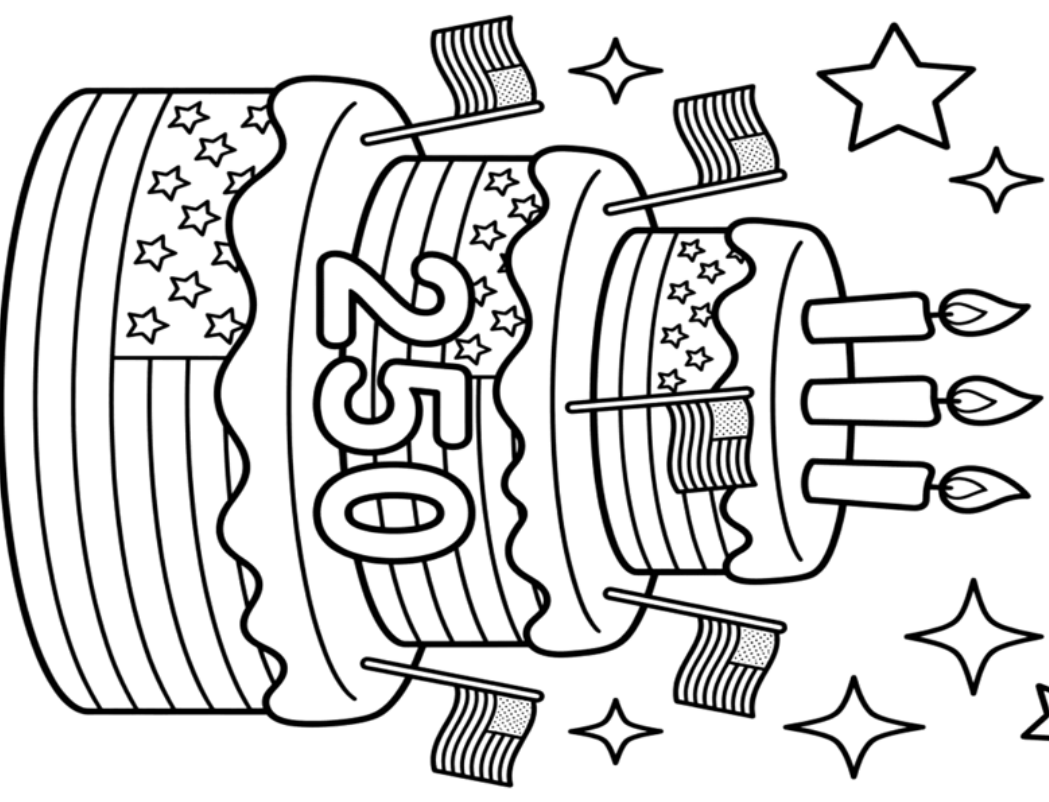
