#### **April 2-4 – The Triduum**

The Easter Triduum begins with the Vigil of Holy Thursday. It marks the end of the forty days of Lent and the beginning of the three-day celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ - Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday. The Fathers of the Second Vatican Council reminded us of the extraordinary significance of the Triduum: "Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. Therefore the Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year."

#### **April 5 – Easter Sunday - The Resurrection of the Lord**

The tomb is empty. Death could not contain the One who poured Himself out in Love. The debt has been paid, the last enemy death has been defeated, hell has been conquered, the captives have been liberated, love has triumphed, and heaven's gates have been opened wide. He is Alive and all those who stand at the Altar of the Cross, believing in His promise, shall live forever in Him. Through taking on our very humanity, He did for us what we could never have done.

#### **April 5 through April 12 – The Octave of Easter**

With the whole Church we rejoice at the resurrection of Christ! The Church celebrates the Easter season or Eastertide. St. Athanasius said, "the fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one 'great Sunday,'" but the first eight days, or octave specifically, celebrate the Solemnity of Easter every day.

#### **April 12 – Divine Mercy Sunday**

The special graces that Christ promised us for the Octave day of Easter flow solely through the worthy reception of the Eucharist today. Under the right conditions, we receive a complete renewal of sanctifying grace in our souls. Our Lord promised Saint Faustina that "the souls that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." Today is the crown and glory of the Easter Octave! Pray the Divine Mercy chaplet with your family and friends and rejoice that we have nothing to fear – He has set us free!

#### **April 29 – Saint Catherine of Siena**

Saint Catherine of Siena, whose feast we celebrate on April 29, is a super saint. Not only was she a stigmatist, theologian, philosopher, mystic, and helper to the poor and suffering, but she was also a highly esteemed political ambassador. St. Catherine's most famous work, however, is her Dialogue, a conversation with God pertaining to the spiritual life; a massive work of more than 400 pages, dictated to three secretaries over a period of five days while St. Catherine was in a period of spiritual ecstasy. It teaches us how to come closer to God and benefits the modern reader as much as it did her contemporaries. St. Catherine's Dialogue became the basis for her receiving the title "Doctor of the Church" by Pope St. Paul VI in 1970.





## Feast of Divine Mercy

During the course of Jesus' revelations to Saint Faustina on the Divine Mercy He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The liturgical texts of that day, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy, and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast, which had already been granted to the nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina on 30 April 2000. In a decree dated 23 May 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated that "throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come." These papal acts represent the highest endorsement that the Church can give to a private revelation, an act of Papal infallibility proclaiming the certain sanctity of the mystic, and the granting of a universal feast, as requested by Our Lord to St. Faustina.

### Concerning the Feast of Mercy Jesus said:

*Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.*  
(Diary 300)

*I want the image solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it.* (Diary 341)

*This Feast emerged from the very depths of My mercy, and it is confirmed in the vast depths of my tender mercies.*  
(Diary 420)

*On one occasion, I heard these words: My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. **The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.\*** [our emphasis] On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.* (Diary 699)

*Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it.* (Diary 742)

*I want to grant complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy.* (Diary 1109)

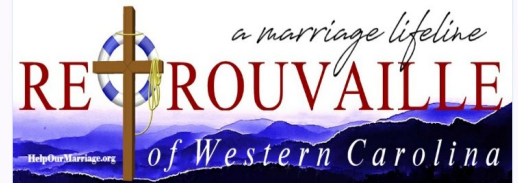

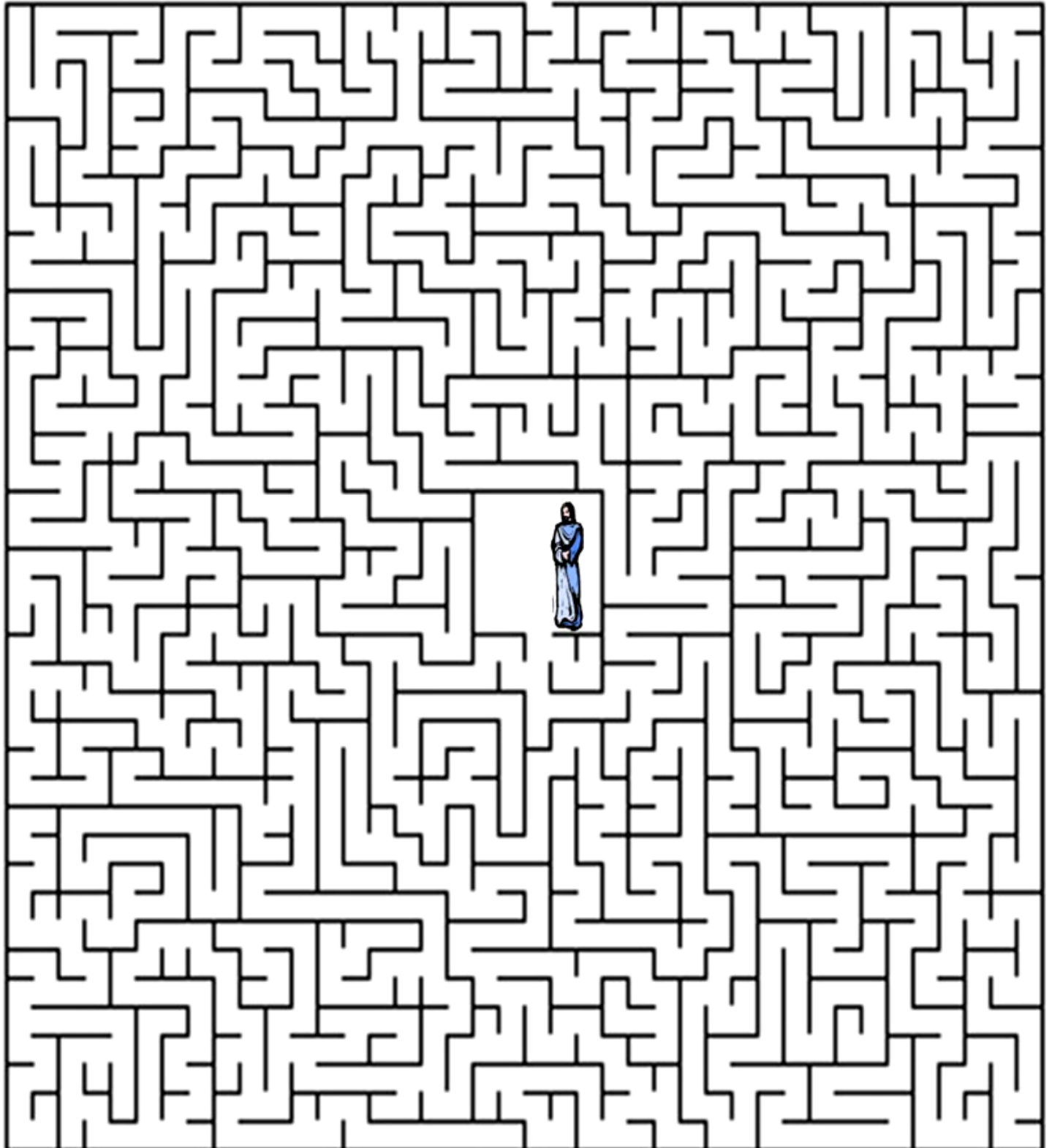
