The Service Committee is asking for donations to help feed people in our community who are having trouble putting food on their tables. Both CAB (Christian Assistance Bridge) and The Richland County Sheriff's Department Food Bank cannot keep up with the overwhelming request for food assistance. Families are really struggling and Transfiguration has always been a very generous Parish towards those in need. Please consider how you are able to help.

CAB (Christian Food Assistance) food pantry items are running very low. They are in need of the following:

Canned Items:

Baked Beans, Black-eyed Peas, Butter Beans, Carrots, Collard Greens, Diced Tomatoes, Fruit, Kidney Beans, Mixed Vegetables, Pasta Sauce, Peas, Potatoes, and Yams

Other Food Items:

Boxed Mashed Potatoes, Cereal, Gravy Mix, Jelly, Pancake Mix, Pancake Syrup, and Stuffing Mix

Needed at the Richland County Sheriff's Department Food Pantry:

Cleaners/Personal Items:

Baby wipes, Body wash, Boxes of fabric softener, Men's and Women's deodorant, Men's and Women's shampoo and conditioner, and other household cleaners including Windex

Canned Items:

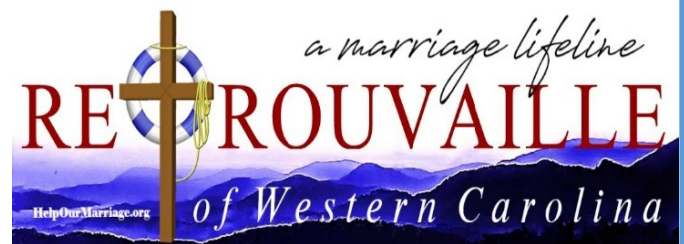

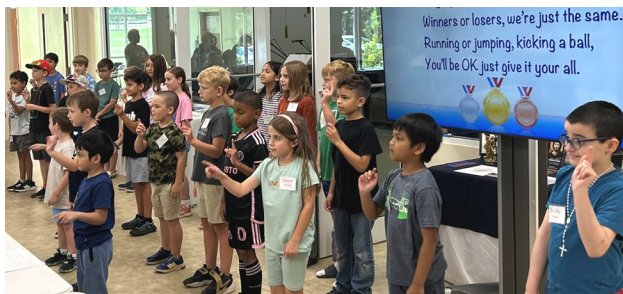

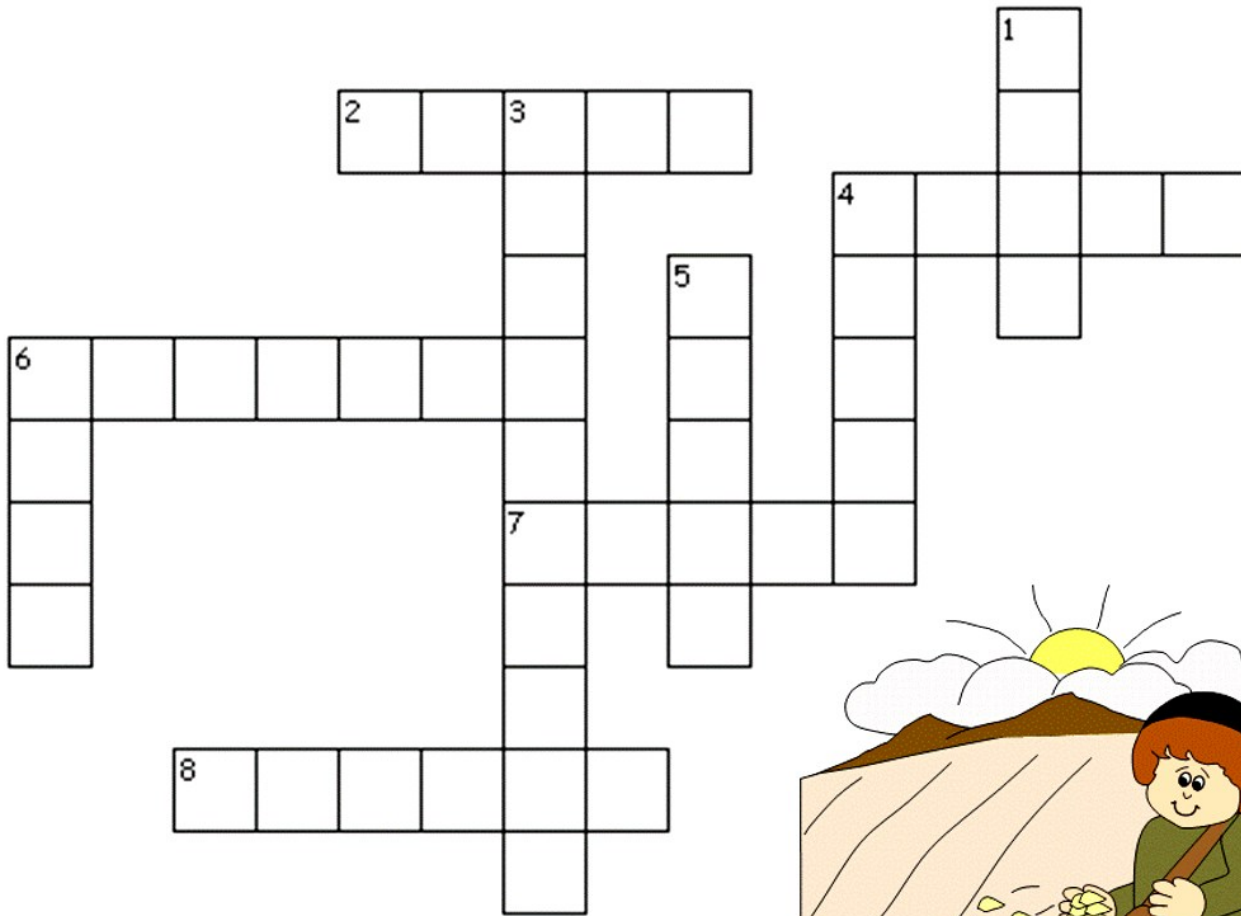
