

A Charity of Note: Big Red Barn Retreat




The Big Red Barn Retreat Providing a place for peace



Dear Parishioners,

At this time of year, I usually ask your help with Bags for Badges to support our local law enforcement. However, because food prices have gone up and deputies' salaries have not, they are having a great bit of difficulty having dinner. Restaurants used to give them a free meal if they were in uniform and on duty. Now, they are working 12 hour shifts and some places are giving them free drinks, but not as many as before.

To show our support of our law enforcement, Deacon John and I are asking that you consider making a donation for us to purchase restaurant gift cards to help the deputies have meals while they are working. **There are two ways you can help out:**

- 1. You can purchase a gift card from one of the restaurants listed below and put it in an envelope marked "Dinner for Deputies" and place it in the collection basket during Mass or drop it by the parish office. Or...

As we celebrate Memorial Day and Fourth of July, let us think about and pray for the men and women that defend our communities and keep us safe. Thank you for your consideration and generosity.






