



Dagmar Rinnenburger received her medical degree from the University of Freiburg in Germany. She specializes in Pneumology and Allergology. Before moving to Italy in 1991, she worked at the Black Forest Clinic (a highly specialized cardiological and pneumological rehabilitation hospital) and at the Hemer Hospital (Germany), a hospital specialized in oncological pneumology and infectious pneumology. In Italy she worked from 1996 until 2003 at the Fondazione S. Lucia, Scientific Institute of Neurorehabilitation in Rome.

From 2003 to 2021, she worked at San Camillo Hospital in respiratory intensive care as a medical director level 1, dealing with invasive and non-invasive ventilation and focusing in particular on patients suffering from respiratory failure due to neuromuscular problems, such as amyotrophic lateral sclerosis and muscular dystrophy, in various practical, clinical, and ethical aspects.

She developed a questionnaire on end-of-life decisions in respiratory failure.

She is the author of various publications and has often been invited to speak at courses and conferences.

In her publications she has particularly taken care of the aspect of chronic diseases and educational therapy (e.g. "L'educazione terapeutica nell'asma bronchiale", (Critical Medicine Publishing, 2002, pp.100) and end-of-life decisions in respiratory failure (see Janus Notebooks "Decidere in medicina : Pattinando insieme sul ghiaccio, ottobre 2007 editore Zadigroma).

She has published the book : La cronicità. Come prendersene cura, come viverla (Il Pensiero Scientifico, 2019).

The book was translated into English by Springer in 2021 with the title "Cronicity, treating and coping" and was translated into German and published by Springer Nature Switzerland with the title "Chronische Erkrankungen; Behandlung und Bewältigung."

She has lectured at the Unicamillus University in Rome on the subject of chronicity.
