Funeral Meeting Questions

Below are some questions we will ask in our planning meeting to ensure the wishes of the deceased and family get met:

Will this be a full Mass or a funeral service?

What parish would you like this to take place in?

What date are you looking at for the services?

Are you having a visitation?

What time would you like the visitation to start?

What time would you like the service or Mass to start?

Will someone do a eulogy?

Would the family like to use the musicians and cantors and the church for the service?

For a full Mass, we will need 2 readings selected. Do you have a preference? If not, we can help you select the readings.

Reading #1: Old Testament

Reading #1 New Testament

Responsorial Psalm

Gospel Reading

Hymns:

Gathering Hymn, Preparation of the Gifts, Communion Hymn, and Recessional Hymn

In all, 4 hymns, 1 responsorial psalm, and 2 readings need to be selected for a full Mass

Would anyone from the family like to proclaim the readings?

Would anyone like to bring up the gifts?

Is there an obituary posted for the deceased?

Would you like a picture of the deceased used in the funeral program? Is the one from the obituary ok?

Will there be a full body or an urn present?

Do you plan to have a luncheon at the church?

Do you plan to have a burial on the day of the funeral?

If so, would you like the burial directly after the service or after the luncheon?

If time permits, would you like it announced in our parish bulletin and in the announcements?
