MISCELLANEOUS:

Mayor Buckley attended the County Legislature meeting on May 18, 2026. A temporary moratorium was put into place regarding biosolid field applications. Existing contracts held by the City of Hornell are not affected by the moratorium. The Hornell Water Pollution Control Plant’s testing for PFAS presence has remained well below the required standard.

Mayor Buckley attended the New York Conference of Mayor’s annual meeting last week. Reform to the NYS Retirement System’s Tier 6 was a dominating topic. Union officials are proposing lowering retirement age and employee contributions, which if passed could cause a ripple affect to employees in Tier 5. This ripple affect would cause an increase in costs to municipalities state wide.

Municipalities are still waiting for the NYS Budget to pass. Officials are in the 13th budget extender period.

On June 11, 2026, the “Big Boy” Locomotive will make a stop at Hornell’s Erie Depot
