Miscellaneous:

- The Codes office presented 2 properties that have been declared unsafe and will be demolished. They are both privately owned and the owners have contracted with the demo company.
- Chief Smith reported that Greg Kramer is finishing up paramedic school. Smith said that they had received a few calls for heart attacks during deer season. The Chief informed the board that one of the trucks will need to be replaced within the next year. It is a 1997 and was purchased in 1998. Brzozowski reported that the ambulance retro fit is in the final stages and will be here after the first of the year.
- Code Officer Bud Burdett said he is working on the final narrative for the Zombie Grant. The state wants to look at the stats and possibly do another grant.
- Chief Murray said Officer Losecco will finish the academy at the end of next week and will then be on field training for 6-8 weeks. Last Saturday, officers took part in the “Shop with a Cop” at Wal-Mart. The event was a big success – officers volunteered their time and even used their own money for some of the purchases.
- Mayor Buckley said that he and the commissioners will be interviewing this afternoon for one of the openings at the police department. They will also begin interviews for the fire captain position that is now vacant with Brzozowski taking the Chief position.
