A presentation was given by the Hornell Fire Department and information was handed out about their newly approved Inhouse Recruit Training Program. It has been beneficial for training and our program is fit to our needs.

Chief Murray said that Officer Kerr is back as the SRO. Officer Crouch is going through field training. All of the guys are going through firing training.

Bud Burdett spoke of the issues with landlords and evictions. Due to COVID, court is up in the air right now. There are two problem properties that have been vacated and they are working to get these properties back up and running and non-blighted. Building permits are still going and they have been busy with them. After October 15, they will not have to deal with grass issues until spring!
