# AVI20325 – Certificate II in Transport Security Protection

## Fact Sheet

ISS Training Pty Ltd is approved as a Skills Assure Supplier (SAS) to deliver Career Start - General Training. Career Start supports Queensland job seekers to start their career, or move into more skilled roles or full-time employment. Access to subsidised training under this program is subject to eligibility requirements and funding rules so it is important to check your eligibility and choose your course carefully.

### What is Career Start ?



Career Start is one of the Queensland Government's core funded vocational education and training (VET) programs, managed by the Department of Trade, Employment and Training (DTET). Career Start provides individuals with the skills and support to start their career.

The program provides training to help individuals find a job and supports those already employed to move into more skilled roles or full-time employment, including after completing an apprenticeship or traineeship. Career Start supports delivery of entry-level training to students, apprentices and trainees aligned with the skill outcomes required by industry.

Career Start offers either a general training pathway or employment-based apprenticeship or traineeship pathway.

#### General Training Pathway:

Qualifications and introductory skill sets delivered through a general training pathway are available for direct enrolment and do not require the student to enter into a training contract (apprenticeship/traineeship) with an employer

#### Apprenticeship/Traineeship Pathway:

For apprenticeships and traineeships, an individual must be employed as an apprentice or trainee. This pathway is part of the Australian Apprenticeships system and requires all parties to sign an Apprenticeship and Traineeship Training Contract (the Contract) as defined by the Further Education and Training Act 2014 (the Act).

### Career Start Eligibility Criteria

#### General Training Pathway Eligibility Criteria:



- Be aged 15 years or older.
- Not be a school student.
- Permanently reside in Queensland;
- Be an Australian citizen, or permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident who holds a valid visa and working rights on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen.
- not already have a certificate III or higher qualification completed within the last 10 years immediately preceding the individual's enrolment (qualifications completed as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not impact eligibility);
- not be enrolled in another DTET-funded qualification, even if it is on hold or deferred, (foundation skills qualifications and self-funded/fee-for-service qualifications do not impact eligibility).

### What is a Co-Contribution Fee?



Under Career Start, the Queensland Government covers most of the training cost, but students pay a co-contribution fee as a sign of commitment to their study. These fees may differ based on a student's concessional status.

See the schedule to the on the next page for the specific Co-contribution fee for this course.

The co-contribution fee is the amount payable for the qualification by an eligible student. This fee may differ for some courses depending on if the student qualifies for a concession rate or not.

### Student Support



All students will be provided with a range of learning support options and resources to help them achieve competency. This includes:

- Trainer led webinars (delivered via Video conference and Face-to-face) will be scheduled for group training as required.
- Trainer support is available to students via phone, online training portal messaging, text and/or email to assist students during the pre-practical training block.
- One-to-one support during the face-to-face training block.
- Trainer to refer student to relevant external services where appropriate.

### Eligible Training Combinations under Career Start

**Under Career Start, students may access subsidised training for up to two qualifications, depending on the pathway chosen. The eligible training combinations are:**

#### Eligible Training Combination One

- A Student may undertake **one Certificate II or III qualification** through the General Pathway using Career Start Funding

#### Eligible Training Combination Two

- A student may undertake **one Certificate II or III qualification through the General Training Pathway**, followed by **one apprenticeship or traineeship** using Career Start funding.

#### Eligible Training Combination Three

- A student may undertake **two apprenticeships or traineeships at Certificate II or III level (one after the other)** using Career Start funding

#### Additional Skill Set Access

- A student may also access one introductory-level skill set under Career Start funding, in addition to the combinations above.
- As part of receiving a subsidised training place, students may be asked to complete a DTET survey

This fee can be paid by an employer, a family member, a friend, or another organisation, but it cannot be paid or waived by the SAS/RTO or any person or entity connected to the SAS. The fee amount is a decision for the SAS/RTO.

### Course fees

To meet our government funding program requirements, ISS Training only charge a student a maximum of 30% of their co-contribution fee on enrollment. ISS Training manages this by invoicing students in two (2) instalments. The first instalment is for approximately (but not more than) 30% of the co-contribution fee and is payable before training commences.

The second instalment is for the balance of the co-contribution fees and will be due approximately 2-8 weeks after enrolment depending on the training timeline for completion. Payment of the second invoice is required to remain enrolled. See the fee schedule above for the specific co-contribution fee for each course.

Students will have 7 days in which to pay each invoice. Our Refund Policy can be located on our website.

### Concessional Fee eligibility

Concessional student status applies when the student falls into one of the following categories:

- hold a Health Care, Veteran, or Pensioner Concession Card, or are the partner or dependent of someone with such a card and are named on the card;
- have a Commonwealth form confirming eligibility for concessions under a Health Care, Veteran, or Pensioner Concession Card;
- identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander (First Nations people);
- have a disability;
- are adult prisoners;

\* AVI20325: Certificate II in Transport Security Protection – Further Funding Note

Students may access funding for AVI20325 or CPP20218 Certificate II in Security Operations but not both qualifications. Certificate II Training and Support Plans are not required unless students are assessed as a disadvantaged learner. Funding is primarily for the International Airport Screening Officer occupation for the listed subsidies. Students can choose to enrol in the other occupations - Air Cargo Examination Officer (capped at 9 Units in Total), with subsidies subject to the Total Units required to complete these specified occupations. Students may already hold a certificate III or higher level qualification not funded through the QLD Certificate 3 Guarantee or Higher Level Skills programs or SAS Programs for General Training.

### Course information

The course duration is typically 4 – 8 weeks – Elapsed Time.

Students need to complete their online pre-practical training and assessment within (3) weeks of enrolment. Students will then be assigned a Start Date at an Airport where they will complete the remaining course requirements completing the practical training and assessment.

Individuals undertaking this qualification must have passed a valid security background check prior to accessing security-restricted resources associated with the unit AVIG0006 - Work effectively in a transport security environment.

This course has been designed as a blended course; therefore, students will be learning and practicing in a variety of settings including online learning and assessment conducted at your home or location, in the classroom and at the airport in non-operational and live/operational screening lanes to experience first-hand the use of aviation security screening equipment.

The course has been developed with an upfront online training component that students undertake prior to attendance at a practical training and assessment block.
