GIRLS PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The WPGA Junior Foundation is pleased to announce Payton Haugen (Brookfield) as the Junior Girls Player of the Year.

A member of the Class of 2026 and a future Michigan State Spartan, Payton put together one of the most impressive seasons in state history. She delivered elite performances throughout the year, highlighted by rounds of 66 and 67 (-11) at the WPGA Championship.

Payton claimed victories at the Players Tour at Blackwolf Run and the 38th Lake Arrowhead Invitational, consistently rising to the occasion against top competition. She saved her best for the fall, capturing the WIAA Girls State Championship and earning Player of the Year honors in record-breaking fashion.

Finishing the state championship at -12 under par for 36-holes, Payton shattered the previous tournament record of -6, setting a new benchmark for excellence.

Kade continued his success with a victory at the WPGA Boys Junior Championship, firing rounds of 65 and 70 to finish at 135. Throughout the summer, he consistently placed among the top finishers, including third at the WSGA State Junior, runner-up finishes at the Tour Championship and the 38th Lake Arrowhead Invitational, and multiple additional top-five performances against elite competition.

The 28th Annual Cup Matches took place at Oak Ridge GC in Hopkins, MN on July 11-12. This annual event showcases 12 boys and 12 girls from Wisconsin against Team Minnesota in a Ryder Cup team-type event that started back in 1998. Team WI led 7 to 5 after day one of four ball matches. Team MN then won 16.5 of the possible 24 points in singles matches to win the overall total of 21.5-14.5 points. Team MN takes the cup for another year and the overall series now at 14-12-2 to Team MN. Players are selected off the Player of the Year points list from the previous year.

Each league votes on their eight person team who will represent their area in the Section qualifiers and potentially Championship. Wisconsin has 26 different leagues throughout the state. A special thanks to University Ridge and Pleasant View Golf Course for hosting this season's 13u and 17u Section Championship.

In the 13u division, TPC Wisconsin, coached by Dillon Parisi, claimed 1st place overall and earned a trip to the Regional Championship hosted at Grand Geneva Resort in September. Likewise, TPC Wisconsin's 17u crew were crowned Champions and also earned a trip to the Regional Championship.

At the Regional, TPC's 17u team was just shy of another Champion title which would have propelled them to the National Finals. 13u had a respectable finish as well losing by just one point in the semi-finals.

Mike Schnarr Scholarship \$10,000 (One boy recipient)



The Balance & Believe Foundation is proud to announce **Camden Goninen** of DeForest as the Mike Schnarr Scholarship recipient. Mike Schnarr has been a longstanding member of the Wisconsin PGA. His resume is full of accolades dating back to the early 1970's and he has been Teacher of the Year, Professional of the Year, and a past president of the Wisconsin PGA. Mike would tell you his most proud accomplishment of his presidency was the inception of the Wisconsin PGA Junior Tour. This tour was one of the first in the country and now boasts some of the largest fields and number of events statewide. The Wisconsin PGA thought it was time to honor Mike with his very own Mike Schnarr Championship. This championship is the last event of the year for boys to get points to win POY. When the PGA approached Mike about starting this new event, he wanted to make sure that everyone knew he was about growing the game for all genders, not just the boys. Since his son Derek started the Sherri Steinhauer Championship to help grow women's golf in the state it seemed right for his father to host the boys. It is only fitting for both Championships to be played at Blackhawk Country Club where Mike and Derek have been golf professionals for over 50 years.

Sherri Steinhauer Scholarship \$10,000 (One girl recipient)



The Balance & Believe Foundation is proud to announce **McKenna Lowe** of Sherwood as the Sherri Steinhauer Scholarship recipient. Sherri Steinhauer qualified for the LPGA Tour in 1986 and had a successful 26 year career. Her 8 victories included 2 majors: the 1992 du Maurier Ltd Classic and the 2006 Women's British Open. She also won the British Open in 1998 and 1999 before it became a major. She played on the United States team in the Solheim Cup matches four times and passed the \$6 million mark in career earnings. She continues to attend the Sherri Steinhauer Girls Championship, named after her each year and pass along her knowledge of the game onto our young junior girls.

American Family Insurance Scholarship - \$3,750 each (One boy and One girl recipient)

The WPGA Junior Foundation has teamed up with the Steve Stricker American Family Insurance Foundation to offer these two scholarships. American Family Insurance has brought a new PGA Champions Tour event to Wisconsin. The event was played at University Ridge on June 12-14. As part of the event the Steve Stricker American Family Insurance Foundation is making charitable donations to groups around the state and the WPGA Junior Foundation was chosen to receive some of these funds.

Balance and Believe Scholarship - \$3,500 each (Two recipients)

The Balance & Believe Foundation, based in Madison, WI, was formed in 2014 by Derek Schnarr to help promote junior golf, teach life lessons, and focus on community service. These three pillars of the Foundation come together in the Foundation's mission statement - Promoting junior golf, while providing a platform for kids to give back to the community. Over the past four years the Foundation has used this event, previously called the Michael Luedtke Memorial Golf Outing, to raise the necessary funds to support the multitude of programs in the Madison area they are involved with. The programs range from the Food Pantry and Resource Center at Falk Elementary School, to the Snack Pack program at Olson Elementary School, B&B36 program, Longest Day of Golf, and the B&B Community, Michael Luedtke, and Dick Wilson Memorial Scholarships.

Terry was a tribute to golf, but more importantly a tribute to respect and love of mankind and the ability to spread happiness with his kindness and constant smile. Terry was first and foremost a loving husband, brother, uncle, and friend to all he met. Terry was also a proud Army veteran from the Vietnam era, serving most of his time in Germany and at The Presidio in San Francisco, CA. Finally, Terry was an avid, passionate golfer who spread his goodwill on the course and off.

The Rain or Shine Golf Scholarship (\$2,000)

Ethan Herrmann of Greenfield was awarded the Rain or Shine Golf Scholarship. Rain or Shine is proud to launch this scholarship in partnership with the Wisconsin Jr PGA. Rain or Shine Golf's founder, Shawn Foley, was an active participant in many of the WPGA Junior Foundation events over the years, and was really shaped into the golfer and person he is today due to the influence that the WPGA Junior Foundation had on his childhood. Shawn was a junior player from 2004 - 2010 and went on to play collegiately at Northern Illinois University, before starting Rain or Shine Golf in 2016. The Rain or Shine Golf Scholarship aims to support a recipient with aspirations of playing golf at the collegiate level, while also striving for great academic success in the classroom.
