Over the past month I have heard many stories about Grace, sharing history about where you have been and hope for where God is leading us next. When you grow up in New Orleans like Carla and I did, you just know "real" life and hospitality isn't what you find in a tourist brochure or in the French Quarter. More amazing food comes out of corner mom & pop restaurants well outside of the Quarter or downtown than in it. The fun Mardi Gras happens out in the neighborhoods, not in the Canal Street crowds. It's the tradition of Monday, when a pot of red beans has been cooking on low all day in a Magalite pot. IYKYK. It's not fancy and was never meant to be. When your kid walks in the door at suppertime with a friend or four, you don't ask if they've eaten—you just grab extra plates, pull more chairs up to the table, and make room. It's simple and genuine.

I'm learning that a similar spirit of hospitality is easy to find here, too. Here at Grace, its making sure there is a welcome for everyone, always room at the table, and enough to go around...a wonderful picture of how every church is called to be. Hebrews 13:2 tells us, *"Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it."* reminding us to practice genuine hospitality with everyone. Our faith isn't meant to be lived out by ourselves, but in the everyday, authentic sharing of our lives.

My hope for Grace is that we are known as a community where everyone who steps through our doors feels that immediate sense of welcome and belonging. Carla and I certainly have! Whether you have been part of this church family for decades or are just finding your way through the door, you matter here. I look forward to sharing meals with you, learning your stories, and walking together with joy.

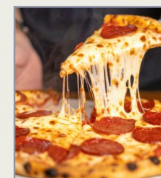

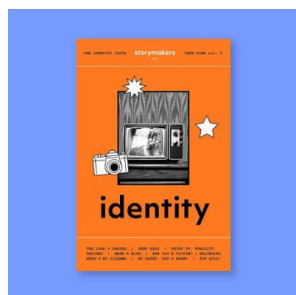

ADULT MINISTRIES

Do you feel called to serve at Grace in a more meaningful way? Maybe you'd like to teach Sunday School, lead a small group, or even take part in a caregiving ministry. If so, Lay Servant Ministries is the place to begin. When I took my first LSM class, I had no idea what to expect but was amazed at how eye-opening it was. The BASIC class showed me so many ways I could serve not only my church, but my community as well. Since then, I have taken an active role on the District LSM committee in the Orangeburg District and now the Greenwood District. At the upcoming Fall training, I will be teaching a class on the Social Principles of the UMC, and I highly recommend it for anyone interested in social justice and activism. If you are interested and would like to know more, I would love to speak with you and help you enroll in the BASIC class. If you've already taken BASIC and need to meet the one class every 3 years requirement, registration is open until September 11.—Pastor Jessica

COURSE OFFERINGS:

- **LSM BASIC:** introductory class designed to help you build core skills in the three key areas of lay leadership: leading, caring, and communicating.
- **United Methodist Heritage:** explores the historical roots, theological foundations, and missional trajectory of the Methodist movement, equipping lay leaders to draw on Wesley's legacy in their modern ministry.
- **United Methodist Polity:** course examines the organizational structure, decision-making processes, and relational connection of The UMC to help laity navigate and participate effectively in church governance.
- **Justice in Everyday Life:** course takes an in-depth look at the UMC Social Principles, guiding participants to integrate biblical justice and social action into their daily lives, local church, and broader community.

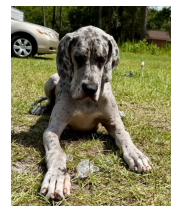

News from our Treasurer

Increase to WINGS Meal Pricing



GUMC is making an adjustment to the pricing of WINGS dinners. The policy of GUMC has long been that the Kitchen meal pricing would be structured so that the Kitchen account would break even over the course of the budget year. The unexpected and unusual increases to food prices have resulted in a YTD deficit of \$4,616.85. An increase in meal prices for adults to \$10 and for children to \$8 will be immediately implemented to begin to correct the ongoing deficit while minimizing the potential impacts on participation.

Further adjustments may be required; therefore, we are also implementing a quarterly review and report to the Chair, Finance Committee and the Treasurer by the Business Administrator, the Kitchen Manager and the Minister of Adult & Youth Discipleship.
