Creativity and Relaxation—Living into the Image of God

When God began to create the heavens and the earth, the earth was without shape or form...Then God said, "Let us make humanity in our image to resemble us...On the sixth day God completed all the work he had done, and on the seventh day God rested..."

-selected verses from Genesis 1 & 2



This summer has provided me with an unexpected gift — free time! As a seminary student, it has become easy to believe that "free time" has become extinct for me, but having several months off between classes has helped me remember what it is to have this kind of freedom. The freedom in my time led me right through the doors of a local yarn shop to buy materials for a crochet project.

A random fact about me is that I fancy myself to be a bit of a fiber artist. I love to knit and crochet, and even taught myself how to use both a drop spindle and an electric spinning wheel during COVID. I am always amazed that a project can go from a printed pattern and a jumble of fibers into finished garment. The chaos of the raw materials can be tamed and shaped, ordered and formed, into a wearable piece of art. Humanity's ability to create out of the mess is one of the many ways that we reflect back the likeness of our God. Whether it is creating the right stitch pattern with a hook, combining the right ingredients in a recipe, or organizing a flurry of ideas into an effective path forward, the creativity bound up within the human soul is a direct echo of the One Who Created us.

Many artists and other creative types describe sometimes falling into a "flow state," where ideas flow freely and time seems to stand still. I found myself achieving a moment of this clarity and deep enjoyment while on a recent trip to Edisto with my family. This is always a place of rest for me and I found myself truly content while looking out onto the beach as I worked on my current fiber project. As I wove together the thin strands of thread, I considered what it must have been like as God wove together the very fabric of our universe. It occurred to me how true rest and the capacity to be creative are so intertwined. When we are constantly running from one thing to the next, we find that we are just too exhausted to think outside the box or generate new ideas. How far from our intended image do we wander when we do not allow ourselves to rest or to have the space to be creative in some way?



As we continue to enjoy the summer, I encourage you to take stock of how well you are living into the parts of your *image of God-ness* that reflect back cycles of creativity and rest. Find moments to breathe, find ways to make something new — with your hands or with your mind. Spend time contemplating how these moments bring us closer to our Creator.

A Brief Prayer for the Creative Moment

Creator-God, who imagined the world and gave expression to all that is good and right...Idea-Giver, who breathed life into humanity, and sustains life with your presence...Come fill me with creativity, and breathe new inspiration into my heart, soul, mind, and strength. Help me be like you, and reflect your innovation and artistry in the world. Be my inspiration, God, and guide me to fresh and new ideas. Amen.

The hymnals are in the center lobby of the lower Wesley Center for folks to take home .

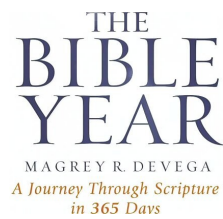

Missions Moment

Ramp Ministry

The ramp ministry got its start over 30 years ago when a group of United Methodist Men were repairing a porch for an elderly member. During that time, it was realized that a ramp was needed also and the first wheelchair ramp was built.

It was then decided to that we reach out to the community to help those who needed a ramp but could not afford one. Requests come in from hospitals, rehab centers and individuals to the church office and then the need is assessed. The church, through its Missions committee budget pays for all the supplies. There are also 2 portable "loaner" ramps available for those going through rehab and not need one permanently.

Over the years, with a core group of 9 men, the ministry has built over 75 ramps for those in the North Augusta area and beyond. It continues to be a way to show God's love to those in need.

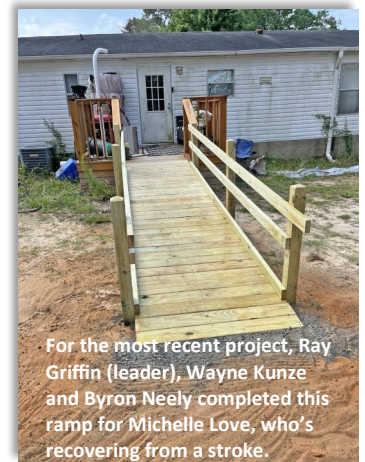

News from our Treasurer

Increase to WINGS Meal Pricing



GUMC must make an adjustment to the pricing of WINGS dinners. The policy of GUMC has long been that the Kitchen meal pricing would be structured so that the Kitchen account would break even over the course of the budget year. The unexpected and unusual increases to food prices have resulted in a YTD deficit of \$4,616.85. An increase in meal prices for adults to \$10 and for children to \$8 will be immediately implemented to begin to correct the ongoing deficit while minimizing the potential impacts on participation.

Further adjustments may be required; therefore, we are requesting a quarterly review and report to the Chair, Finance Committee and the Treasurer by the Business Administrator, the Kitchen Manager and the Director, Adult and Youth Ministries.
