J.R.R. Tolkien




We are on a journey. First, we are walking alongside the Israelites as we read through the Old Testament. Their journey began in Egypt, as God freed them from slavery. But freedom led them to wander in the wilderness for 40 years. Wandering is not necessarily bad. The Israelites learned how to trust God. They built a community held together by law, worship, prayer, obedience, sacrifice, and repentance. Richard Rohr writes, *“Can we trust, like the Israelites, that the way to the Promised Land is through the desert? When we least expect it, there is an oasis...God will make the desert bloom (Isaiah 35:1).”* These are themes for us in the journey of Lent.

The second journey we are on is the road toward the crucifixion and the resurrection. When Jesus was moving toward the cross, the disciples moved at different speeds. Peter, James, and John were so slow they fell asleep in the garden. Judas wanted to speed things up and bring it all to a climax. Peter ran away, denying Jesus three times. Mary and the other women went all the way and stood at the foot of the cross. After the resurrection, the Holy Spirit fanned the flame of the church. The apostles moved in different directions literally and theologically. Paul went across the Mediterranean to convert the Gentiles. John had visions on the island of Patmos. James stayed in Jerusalem primarily, emphasizing works, while Paul preached justification by faith alone. What held the early church together was their unity in Jesus. We all have a different faith journey to walk, but we can walk together.

The key to walking together in faith is loving our neighbor. Jesus prepared his disciples for his death, saying, *“Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”* John 13:34-35 As we walk the journey together, may we love each with patience and kindness. We are not alone as we walk. Jesus is with us. His final words before he ascended into heaven were, *“And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”* Matthew 28:20

Though we ponder, reflect, and look inward during this season, our church is filled with music-making and uplifted voices. Of special note, our congregational singing has been particularly strong and healthy—congratulations and keep it up! Each and every voice can lend itself to the glory of God. Gratitude is also due to our latest organ sidekick, Ben Kauffman, for his interest in the organ and help with Sunday services. Please consider being an organ sidekick or signing up your child. Our Lenten musical offerings will culminate with our Holy Week services (Holy Thursday and Good Friday Tenebrae) on April 2nd and 3rd. This year’s Good Friday service will be a bit out of our norm and will utilize music of the early American hymn tradition rather than the European liturgical canon. Our Chancel Choir is hard at work learning settings of early American hymns and shape-note tunes, which effectively illustrate the austerity of the moment. We are happy to have Edgefield’s own Mr. Brooker Strom as a part of our Tenebrae Service, whose one-of-a-kind rendering of these songs harkens back to a bygone time. Please make plans to attend and be moved by our Good Friday service.

Also, you are invited to attend a very special recital happening this month. Kevin Eckard (NAHS Class of ‘89 and former Grace member!) will present a voice recital on March 13th at Augusta University’s Recital Hall! Kevin is currently Professor of Voice and Head of the Vocal Division at the University of Central Oklahoma and is returning to our area to present a recital and masterclass for AU’s vocal studies program. WINGS Wednesday Program: Why Did Jesus Have to Die? - a study of the atonement

Teachers: Rev. Cathy, Rev. Ashley, Amber Forrest

Despite the crucifixion's central place in Christian faith, the New Testament offers few clear answers about how Jesus' death saves, or why, exactly, he had to die. The New Testament writers use a host of metaphors—ransom, sacrifice, reconciliation, victory—but never explain exactly how it works or why it had to happen this way.

What if that's because we've been asking the wrong question? What if the cross isn't a transaction to be explained, but a living Word from God meant to transform who we are and how we live?






Looking back at the Winter Wonderland Ball
