"Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ."

1 Peter 2:4-5

This month marks the 40th Anniversary of the completion of the new sanctuary building. On Sunday, July 17, 1983, the sanctuary building was destroyed by fire, due to a lightning strike. Rev. Dr. John Younginer, Jr., pastor at the time, wrote a congregational letter that stated, "Sunday, July 17, 1983. The end of one chapter in the life of our church, and the beginning of another." Dr. Younginer described the extensive damage and the plan for moving forward. He ended his letter with these words, "The spirit of Grace is strong, and these events provide exciting opportunities for what we can do together. The love of God is what builds the church. We only provide the building. We need you now more than ever as this great church rallies its soaring spirit from the burning embers of a beautiful place."

As I reflect on that chapter of Grace's history and the chapter we are writing now, I echo Dr. Younginer's words. *The love of God is what builds the church.* May God's love be evident in our words and deeds. *We need you now more than ever.* Our church needs each of you to make the Body of Christ healthy. *These events provide exciting opportunities for what we can do together.* The following events are ways we can unite together in our mission, "To Know Christ and Make His Love Known."

A LOOK BACK AND A LOOK AHEAD WITH GRACE KIDS MINISTRY

The **Children Ministry's Presentation of the 3**rd **grade Bibles** is an annual tradition at Grace, held during both the LifeSong Contemporary worship service and the Traditional worship service where the children receive their Bible gift from the church.



The Bible is viewed as a treasured gift. During the presentation, we pass this treasure to the children so that they may also grow in wisdom, stature, and favor with God and people. After receiving their Bibles, children are encouraged to bring them to Sunday School, where they will learn how to navigate the Bible. They are taught what a Book, a Chapter number, and a Verse number are, as well as how they are represented in the Bible, so that they can confidently look up verses and continue their faith journey.

Your Bolivia Medical Team Returned on July 28 - A Look Back

Grace UMC Mission Team Returns from Bolivia



From July 18–28,2025 a mission team of 11 from Grace United Methodist Church traveled to Bolivia, continuing a partnership that spans over 30 years. While our church has sent many medical teams to the mountains of Bolivia, this trip was unique—only the second in our history (the first in 1997) to serve in the tropics of Bolivia. The different climate, along with new medical concerns specific to the region, meant extra preparation for our team.

Over the course of the week, the team cared for what is estimated to be more than 600 patients at the clinic in Sapecho, Bolivia. Each patient not only received care but also experienced the love and compassion of Christ through the hands of our team. Thanks to the generosity of Grace UMC and our partners, we were able to dispense over \$100,000 worth of much-needed medicines and eyeglasses, over 2,000 toothbrushes and sunglasses, and a Spanish Bible to each family.

The team was welcomed warmly by our Bolivian partners. In La Paz, they were received by the Metodisto Hospital with the Bishop in attendance. In Sapecho, both the Good Samaritan Metodisto Church and the local clinic opened their doors for ministry and partnership. The hospitality and fellowship with our Bolivian brothers and sisters in Christ were a reminder of the deep connections formed over three decades of mission.

Perhaps one of the most meaningful aspects of this trip was the visible passing of the torch in leadership. For decades, Janis Collins has been at the forefront of Grace's Bolivia missions, faithfully leading teams with passion and perseverance. On this journey, however, she embraced a new role—not as leader, but as mentor—supporting Ryan Hendrick as he stepped forward to guide the team for the first time. Watching Janis encourage and Ryan lead was a powerful reminder that God's mission is always bigger than one person, and that the future of our Bolivia partnership is bright.

The team itself was also inspiring, because of the 11 members, four were under the age of 30, representing a new generation stepping into Grace's mission legacy. Eight of the team members had a parent or grandparent who had previously served in Bolivia, showing how faith and service ripple across generations and four were first-time missioners, eager to experience God's work in a new place.





Grace UMC gives thanks for the faithful service of this team, the wonderful leadership of Ryan Hendrick, the mentorship of Janis Collins, and the continued opportunity to serve alongside our partners in Bolivia. We celebrate the lives touched, the seeds of faith planted, and the ongoing story God is writing through this mission.
