The deadline for ticket requests is Monday, May 4, 2026. I am hopeful we will have a great turnout for a time of meaningful prayer, music, and worship.



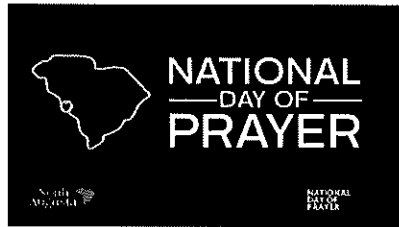
