The Mission Statement of St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we strive to grow in relationship with Him, live the Faith, and share His Good News with others.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wis. 18:6-9; Heb 11:1-2, 18-22; Lk 12:32-48

Today's Gospel presents a powerful and challenging call to readiness, vigilance, and intentional living for believers. This passage, Jesus using vivid imagery, conveys the nature of discipleship and the coming of the Kingdom, and its urgent message.

The opening verses, give us a clear picture of how we are to wait for the coming of our Lord. He

asks us to be ready when he comes and knocks, to open the door for him. This paints a picture of active anticipation. The "dressed for service" imagery evokes a posture of preparedness and diligence, implying that disciples should not be idle but actively engaged in the work of God. The burning lamps symbolize spiritual alertness, faith, and perhaps the light of good works shining in the world. It's not a passive wait, but one filled with purpose and vigilance, like

servants who are ready to attend to their master's needs at any moment.

The surprising blessing pronounced upon these watchful servants is particularly striking: "It will be a privilege for the master to come and wait on them. He will seat them at the table and serve them as they eat." This reversal of roles, with the master serving his diligent servants, underscores the immense reward and honor that awaits those who remain faithful and prepared. It speaks to the intimate relationship Jesus desires with His followers and the boundless grace He extends. This image offers immense comfort and motivation, suggesting that our faithful service here will be met with divine favor and a joyful communion in the future.

Jesus then reiterates the theme of readiness with a slight shift in emphasis: "You must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an unexpected hour." This emphasizes the unpredictable nature of the Master's return, whether it refers to the ultimate Second Coming or the unexpected moments when God intersects with our lives. It reminds us to live each day with intentionality and purpose. The parable of the thief in the night further reinforces this unpredictability. Just as a homeowner would be on guard if they knew the time of a break-in, disciples

are urged to live in a constant state of readiness, not knowing the precise moment of the Master's arrival. This isn't meant to incite fear, but rather a healthy sense of urgency and responsible stewardship of our lives and time. Being "dressed for service" implies that our faith is not merely a belief system but a call to action. We are to be actively engaged in living out our faith, serving others, and contributing to God's kingdom

here on earth.

The incredible image of the Master serving His servants is a profound reminder of God's grace and the unimaginable blessings awaiting those who are faithful. It provides hope and encouragement amidst the challenges of discipleship. This is a timeless call to live with a sense of eternal perspective while being fully present and engaged in our earthly responsibilities. It's a reminder that true discipleship involves a watchful heart, active service, and a joyful anticipation of the Master's coming, whenever and however that may be.

VISITING CARDINAL

PETER EBERE CARDINAL OKPALEKE, bishop of the Diocese of Ekwulobia in Anambra State. Nigeria, has been staying at the St. Boniface rectory with his secretary, Fr. Lawrence, from July 31—August 22 and offering Mass at various parishes raising money for a home for orphaned and neglected children and a home for the elderly of his diocese who have been displaced from their homes and have no one left to care for them. Religious sisters from the diocese will serve those in need, regardless of their background or faith.

The Cardinal and Fr. Milota came to know one another when they both lived in Rome in 2003 and he ministered in Father's home parish that summer. He was made a cardinal on August 27, 2022 by Pope Francis and participated in the 2025 conclave that elected Pope Leo XIV.

Nigeria is reported to be the deadliest country for Christians worldwide, with more Christians killed for their faith than in the rest of the world combined, according to research by Open Doors. Cardinal Okpaleke's Diocese is in the heart of these persecutions and it is not uncommon for priests and religious to be kidnapped or assaulted.

He will be offering Sunday Mass on August 17 at St. Boniface at 8:30am and at St. Liborius at 10:30am. Second collections will be taken up at both parishes to support his efforts to assist our brothers and sisters in Nigeria.

The Diocese of Ekwulobia is rural, impoverished, and plagued by violence and instability. With rising unemployment and scarce resources, many adults have fled to the cities, leaving behind children and the elderly—often abandoned, neglected, or vulnerable.

It's not often we have the chance to listen to a Cardinal so close to home. Please consider taking this opportunity!


