The donation box and envelopes are located in the religious education entrance. Every dollar in cash equals \$8 of purchasing power for the pantry.



If you have any questions regarding FACTS call: 1-866-412-4637. **DO NOT SEND** the FACTS application to the JDCCW office. There is a \$40 fee for the **FACTS** application that needs to be submitted to FACTS at the time of application, along with a copy of the family's 2022 income tax report.

During Lent we learn many things. One of these things is realizing that Jesus gave us new meaning to our pain and suffering. Lent is indeed meant to be a time of repentance and penitence, a time of sacrifice and reflection in which we acknowledge the weight of suffering in the world and in our lives, suffering that always has its roots in sin. This suffering is always part of the story of every human life, with or without Christ; but with Christ, it goes beyond this life on earth. Our personal crosses purify us of selfishness, if we allow them to, teaching us to lean more on Christ and to have a greater experience of his wisdom and joy - his resurrection. In our Catholic faith, the cross and resurrection are two sides of the same coin; we must never allow ourselves to think of one without thinking of the other.



Our faith helps us see suffering in new, deeper perspective, something that makes us more willing to endure it with patience and courage. Through faith we can simply be less afraid of it. We can imagine ourselves as a child who walks through a dark passage holding his father's hand - we know that our Father can handle the darkness and lead us through it. We can face suffering, embrace it, work through it, and transform it, and help others do the same - if we live it as Christ teaches us to, by leaning on his grace. hearts around even the bitterest pains of life, the heaviest and absorb them, transforming them into holiness and wisdom. With Christ, the pains and sorrows of life become valuable opportunities, springboards for ascending the heights of spiritual maturity. God chose to save us through life's sorrows, not from them - and so, there is no reason to fear them.

Pope Benedict explains this beautifully in his encyclical letter on hope (Spe salvi, #s 37-38): "...We can try to limit suffering, to fight against it, but we cannot eliminate it. It is when we attempt to avoid suffering by withdrawing from anything that might involve hurt, when we try to spare ourselves the effort and pain of pursuing truth, love, and goodness, that we drift into a life of emptiness, in which there may be almost no pain, but the dark sensation of meaninglessness and abandonment is all the greater. It is not by sidestepping or fleeing from suffering that we are healed, but rather by our capacity for accepting it, maturing through it and finding meaning through union with Christ, who suffered with infinite love. ...The true measure of humanity is essentially determined in relationship to suffering and to the sufferer. This holds true both for the individual and for society. A society unable to accept its suffering members and incapable of helping to share their suffering and to bear it inwardly through "com-passion" is a cruel and inhuman society."





#### LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to **fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday**.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. Therefore, all of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial. All Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church, pray and perform works of charity and mercy.
- 6. Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence,
