Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Zep 2:3, 3:12-13; 1 Cor 1:26-31; Mt 5:1-12a.

Today's Gospel presents us *The Beatitudes*. This serves as the preamble to the Sermon on the Mount. It is not just a list of "blessings"; it is a radical redefinition of what it means to live in the Kingdom of Heaven. In these verses, Jesus turns the world's hierarchy upside down, offering a theological vision where the "losers" of society are the primary recipients of God's favor.

Theologians often note the significance of Jesus going "up on a mountainside." This mirrors Moses ascending Mount Sinai to receive the Law. However, while Moses brought stone tablets of commands, Jesus brings a living word of grace. He sits down (the traditional posture of a Jewish rabbi) to teach, signaling that these are authoritative instructions for his disciples, and not just advices.

The Greek word used for "blessed" is 'Makarios' which Jesus used in the Beatitudes. It is often translated as "happy," and it carries a much deeper theological weight. It refers to a state of divine favor and spiritual well-being that exists independent of external circumstances. To be *Makarios* is to be right with God, even if the world sees you as broken or lacking.

The Beatitudes are generally divided into two "movements." The first four focus on our relationship with God (poverty of spirit, mourning, meekness, and spiritual hunger). They describe a state of emptiness that only God can fill. This emptiness is the result a total surrender to God. The second four focus on our relationship with others (mercy, purity of heart, peacemaking, and endurance of persecution). These describe the outward fruit of an inward transformation.

The 'Poor in Spirit' is the entry point to the Kingdom. It is the recognition of absolute spiritual bankruptcy before God. 'Those who Mourn' means those have a Godly sorrow for sin and the brokenness of the world. It promises the comfort of God's presence. The Meekness is not weakness, but "power under control." It is the mental power to refuse to use worldly force to achieve one's ends. 'Hunger for Righteousness' is a deep craving for

justice and righteousness to prevail on earth.

The 'Pure in Heart' is a singleness of vision. To be pure in heart is to want "one thing"—God Himself—without a divided loyalty. 'The Peacemakers' are not just "peace-lovers," but those who actively reconcile. They reflect God's character as the ultimate Reconciler. Reconciliation with God gives a peaceful life.

"Already" and the "Not Yet": The Beatitudes introduce a core tension in Christian theology that is the '*Inaugurated Eschatology*'. Jesus uses both present and future tenses: "for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Present) "for they will be comforted" (Future). This suggests that while the

blessing begins the moment we follow Christ, the full realization of that blessing—the end of mourning, the inheritance of the earth, the full sight of God—awaits the final consummation of His Kingdom.

The Beatitudes are not a "ladder" to climb to reach God. Rather, they are a description of the character of those who have already been found by Him. They describe the "counter-cultural" citizen of a Kingdom that values what the world ignores.






