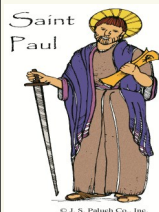

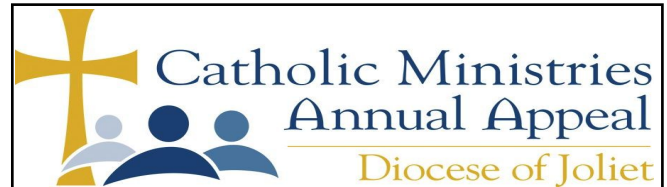
The flowers at the altar are dedicated in honor of the deceased members of the *Neybert / O'Grady Family*.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
Is 8:23-9:3; 1 Cor 1:10-13, 17; Mt 4:12-23

Today's Gospel passage marks a pivotal transition in the Gospel of Matthew: the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It moves from John the Baptist's arrest to Jesus' settling in Capernaum and the calling of his first disciples. It is a profound invitation to recognize the light of Christ and to embrace the radical change of becoming a fisher of men.

The Light in Galilee: *"He left Nazareth and went and lived in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: 'Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali... the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light.'"*

Jesus deliberately chooses Galilee of the Gentiles—a region often seen as peripheral or less devout—as the base for his ministry. Matthew immediately connects this move to the prophecy in Isaiah 9:1-2. This is the central theological point: the Christ, the Messiah, is not just for the holy city of Jerusalem, but for those who are in darkness. Darkness is always a place of doubt, fear, anxiety. Sinfulness is a state of darkness. This passage assures us that Jesus' light is directed precisely toward the overlooked, the confused, and the forgotten. His ministry begins not in a temple, but in a place of humble obscurity. Christ is our Light in the darkness of the world and our own hearts.

"He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him... and they immediately left the boat and their father and followed him." Jesus doesn't call scribes or priests; he calls humble, working fishermen: Simon (Peter), Andrew, James, and John. Their identity is tied to their profession—their lives revolve around their nets and boats. The most striking detail is the word "at once" (or "immediately"). This is not a reluctant, "let me think about it" response. It is a radical, instantaneous

commitment. A total dedication and surrender. They leave behind their source of livelihood, their family, and their established way of life to follow a relative stranger.

They are given a new, divine purpose: "fishers of men." The tool is no longer a net for fish, but the Gospel message itself, used to draw souls toward God's Kingdom.

Are there "nets" in our life that keep us anchored and prevent us from following Jesus completely? The comfort, wealth, a grudge, a habit, or a fear of the unknown, any such thing can be a net that prevents us from following Jesus. The Lord calls us, too, to leave our nets and radically reorient our lives around His mission. Our vocation, no matter our career, is ultimately to be a fisher of men.

The Kingdom is not merely a future hope; it is present now, demonstrated through God's power to heal and transform. We are called to be witnesses to this Kingdom through our words and our actions, bringing Christ's light and compassion to the world.

Our Council of Catholic Women (CCW) represents a community of faith-filled women rooted in prayer, fellowship and service.

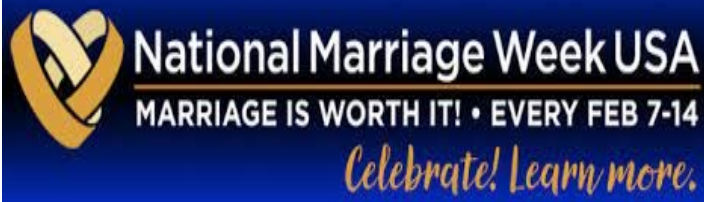

A blessing for couples will be offered by Father Thomas at Masses on February 14 / 15.

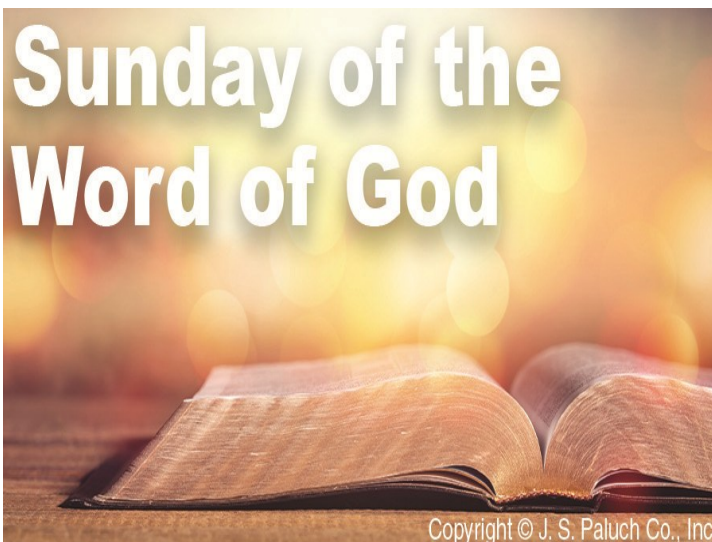
