## Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Gen. 18:1-10a; Col 1:24-28; Lk 10: 38-42

Today's gospel gives us a powerful passage that offers a timeless lesson on priorities, service, and presence. The story of Martha and Mary, two sisters who welcome Jesus into their home, serves as a mirror for our own lives, inviting us to reflect on how we balance our various commitments.

Martha, the older sister, is presented as a diligent and industrious host. She is "distracted by all the preparations that had to be made." Her actions

are not inherently wrong; hospitality was a highly valued virtue in that culture, and she was simply trying to be a good hostess especially because Jesus is their best friend. However, her service becomes a source of anxiety and frustration, leading her to complain to Jesus about her sister. Her focus on doing and serving blinds her to the opportunity of simply being with Jesus.

Mary, on the other hand, embod-

ies a different approach. She "sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said." Her posture of stillness and attentiveness is a stark contrast to Martha's bustling. Mary chooses to prioritize presence over performance, relationship over tasks. She recognizes that the most important thing at that moment is not the meal being prepared or the house being cleaned, but the person of Jesus Himself.

Jesus' gentle rebuke to Martha is the core of the passage. He says, "Martha, Martha... you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." This is not a condemnation of Martha's service but a reordering of her priorities. Jesus affirms that while there is a place for service, it must flow from a place of relationship and communion. The "one thing" that is needed is a heart that is attentive to God's presence.

Ultimately, this passage is a call to intentionality. It challenges us to examine our own lives and ask: Are we so caught up in the "doing" of our faith that we neglect the "being"? Are we so busy serving



God that we fail to simply sit at His feet and listen to Him? The story of Martha and Mary reminds us that while our good works are important, they are not the main event. The main event is the intimate, transformative relationship with Jesus that shapes and informs all our actions. It is a reminder that in the midst of our busy lives, we must always make room for the "better part"—the quiet, attentive presence that will not be taken

away from us.

Jesus appreciates the place taken by Mary. She chose the chosen one of God. Choosing the one necessary thing in life requires, first of all, learning to choose what is right and useful for our lives. As long as we are guided only by our intelligence, we end up doing unimportant things like Martha. However, if we obey our conscience, we begin to do enduring acts like Mary.

A blessing will be offered for grandparents and the elderly at Masses next weekend. We invite and encourage you to attend Mass with your parents / grandparents!


