

Request to be added to the Joliet Diocesan Council of Catholic Women–BBSF FACTS ID#32463. If the family has already submitted a FACTS application for the upcoming year for another award, they are still eligible for the JDCCW-BBSF scholarship. Only one application need be submitted to FACTS at their online site.

If you have any questions regarding FACTS call: 1-866-412-4637. **DO NOT SEND** the FACTS application to the JDCCW office. There is a \$40 fee for the **FACTS** application that needs to be submitted to FACTS at the time of application, along with a copy of the family's 2022 income tax report.

There's an old story about a cowboy who walks into a saloon. He sits on a barstool next to his buddy. His buddy calls to the bar tender and orders a whiskey. When the whiskey arrives, the buddy slides it sideways along the bar to the cowboy and says, "Here's your solution; now tell me your problem." It's one of those old jokes that is kind of bittersweet, because there's a lot of truth in it. Not that alcohol or any drug is a solution to any problems - it isn't. But it is true that we all have problems; the right question isn't, "Do you have a problem?", but "What's your problem?



I think that no one is completely satisfied in life, completely fulfilled; we are all searching for that happiness that we were made for. St Augustine expressed this beautifully at the beginning of his autobiography when he wrote: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O Lord."

One of America's most renowned philosophers and writers, Henry David Thoreau, expressed this same idea less optimistically. He wrote, "Most men lead lives of quiet desperation." The human heart is hungry, but in this fallen world people don't always remember what it's hungry for. Jesus came to put hope into that desperation, to give direction to that restlessness. Only friendship with Him can lead us to the satisfaction we long for, not because it ends our search — that won't happen until heaven — but because it puts us on the sure path, the dependable, hope-filled path of the saints. But that friendship has a price - we have to let him clear away the false gods that are cluttering our hearts. Pope Paul VI summed this up beautifully: "He (Jesus) is the center of history and of the world; He is the one who knows us and who loves us; He is the companion and friend of our life."


Our hearts are the real temple of God - the Holy Spirit and the Blessed Trinity dwell within us. But our sins and selfish actions and habits can turn that temple into a place of confusion, noise, and tension, instead of one where we encounter God and discover his love. Whenever we make a good confession, we give Jesus free entrance into our hearts, so that he can cleanse them, and fill them up again with the light and strength of his friendship.
