


The gourmet wine dinner originally scheduled for Sunday, November 9 has been cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances. Apologies for any confusion caused.

The next business meeting for St. Paul the Apostle Council will be Tuesday November 4 at 7PM at St. Paul the Apostle. All members are encouraged to attend.


Boys and girls in K through 8th grade, be aware that the Council is sponsoring a "Keep Christ in Christmas" poster contest during November. Details to follow.

All Souls Day is not a standalone celebration. It is connected with 'All Saints Day'. In the creed we say the Communion of Saints. It is known as

the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, and is a deep dive into the theological themes of memory, inter-

cession, hope, and the profound unity of the Church.

The Unity of the Church: The Communion of Saints: The Christian tradition views the Church not just as the living on Earth, but as three distinct, yet united, groups:

The Church Triumphant (All Saints): Those in Heaven, who are already united with God and intercede for us.

The Church Militant (The Living): We, who are still fighting the good fight of faith here on Earth.

The Church Suffering (All Souls): Those who have died and are undergoing a final purification (Purgatory) before entering the joy of Heaven.

All Souls Day reminds us that death does not break the bonds of love and prayer. Our relationship with our departed loved ones continues. We are called to fulfill an act of charity by praying for them, helping to expedite their final purification and hasten their entry into the beatific vision of God. This doctrine underscores the radical love and interdependence of the entire People of God.

If we believe that Christ died and rose again, then we also believe that all those who trust in him will be raised with him.

The traditional Mass readings for All Souls' Day often focus on the promise of eternal life: "But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died... but they are at peace."

Jesus says, "This is the will of Him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day."

This day is not meant for grief without comfort, but for a sorrowful hope. We grieve the absence of our

loved ones in this life, but we hold fast to the promise that their journey in Christ will end in glory. Our prayers are not a plea for an uncertain outcome, but an act of love and confidence that God's mercy will be perfected in them.

The celebration of All Souls' Day is also a sober reminder of our own mortality. By focusing on the process of purification after death, we are reminded of the imperfections and venial attachments to sin that hold us back from perfect union with God *now*.

To deepen our reflection on All Souls'
Day, we might consider one of these traditional

practices: The Mass is considered the most powerful prayer for the dead, as it makes present the ultimate act of Christ's sacrifice. Spend time praying at the grave of a loved one or any grave. Light a candle at home or in a church as a symbol of the light of Christ guiding the souls out of darkness and into eternal peace.





#### How to Support Your Priests

Parishioners can encourage the priesthood by praying daily for vocations and for priests, by encouraging men they know to consider the priesthood, and by actively supporting the church's vocation ministry. Encouraging a priestly vocation includes recognizing spiritual commitment, such as regular participation in prayer and spiritual events, and speaking to potential candidates to offer support and invite them to explore the possibility of a vocation. A supportive community that fosters openness to God's call is crucial for men and women to discern and respond to a vocation to the priesthood or religious life.

# The Propaedeutic and Discipleship Stages

A man's formation for priesthood takes place over the course of four stages. The first of these is the Propaedeutic Stage, a year of preparation before diving into academic work. During this year, the seminarian takes time to build a solid foundation in prayer, Scripture, catechesis and community. It is a season of deepening conversion where one learns to live a Christian rhythm of life. The goal is simple: to help a man center his life on Christ.

Upon completion of the Propaedeutic Stage, a man

begins the Discipleship Stage, during which a man begins the study of philosophy. Concurrently, the seminarian deepens his understanding and witness as a follower of Jesus in daily life. He grows in virtue, learns self-discipline, and gains a broad understanding of the human person and the world through his studies. It is a time of becoming a "disciple in heart and mind."

Together, these two stages foster the necessary interior and exterior freedom to hear and respond to the call to the priesthood. Without a firm spiritual foundation built on the habits of a true

disciple, later formation would lack stability. The priesthood is not a job one takes up but a calling one



receives—and the earliest stages are about preparing the soil so that the Lord's call can take root and flourish.

#### **ABOUT FATHER BORELLO**

Fr. Steven Borello is a priest of the Diocese of Joliet currently serving as the Director of Vocations.

Fr. Steven grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and is the oldest of 4 children.

He attended the University

of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana where he studied chemistry and chemical engineering.

While there, he received a call to the seminary to discern the priesthood.

He received his Bachelors in Theology and Masters of Divinity from Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Joliet in 2011.

He first served as an associate pastor at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills and was then transferred to Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville in June of 2014.

In August of 2015, he began

serving at St. John Vianney College Seminary as a spiritual director, director of human formation, and instructor to over 120 men discerning a priestly vocation.

He returned to the Diocese of Joliet in August 2018 to begin as the Director of Vocations.
