We encourage you to attend the class during your pregnancy so there will be no delay in your child's baptism.

First Sunday of Advent Is 2:1-5; Rom 13:11-14a; Mt 24:37-44.

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us of the importance of staying vigilant and prepared for the arrival of the Lord. It is a deeply personal message that speaks to

our hearts and calls us to reflect on the state of our souls. Just as in the days of Noah, when people were caught off guard by the flood, we, too, can become complacent and lose sight of our spiritual journey. This Gospel urges us to be like the faithful servant who remains watchful, eagerly anticipating the return of the master. We need to be spiritually awake, continuously working on building a positive relationship with God and others.

The central command of this Gospel passage is simple: "Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." This call to readiness is essential in Catholic teaching, not out of fear, but out of a hopeful desire to meet Christ, whether at the end of our life or at the end of time.

Jesus compares his second coming to the days of Noah. The people were engaged in normal, everyday activities, but they were spiritually unprepared for the flood, which came suddenly and "swept them all away." The danger is not in the normal activities of life, but the Spiritual Complacency, in allowing them to become a distraction that makes us forget the eternal. The people were lost not because they lived a normal life, but because they lost sight of God in their daily lives.

The people "taken" by the flood are those who are swept away in judgment, while Noah and his family, who were "left" in the ark, were saved for the new creation. Similarly, the two being in the field or at the mill,

the one "taken" is often interpreted as being taken for judgment, and the one "left" is left to enter the Kingdom.

Jesus uses the analogy of the thief to emphasize the unpredictable timing of his return. Just as a homeowner would stay awake and prepared if they knew the time a

stay awake and prepared it they knew the time a thief was coming, we must live in a continuous state of readiness because we do not know the hour. This is not about frantic worry or predicting dates. It is about living righteously today. It means living with a clear conscience, being faithful to our duties, practicing charity, and participating in the sacraments—especially Confession and the Eucharist—which are the primary means God gives us to "stay awake."

The passage serves as a constant reminder, especially during the liturgical season of Advent which focuses on both Christ's first and second coming. Do not let the legitimate worries and the "anxieties of daily life" make your heart "drowsy" or forget your ultimate destination. Be vigilant about sin and regularly seek God's forgiveness, ensuring that we are spiritually clothed in Christ. The preparation is not passive; it is active. We are called to be good stewards of the gifts and time God has given us.

This passage ultimately calls us to embrace the tension of the 'already and not yet': Christ has already come and saved us, but his Kingdom is not yet fully realized, so we must live with both hope and alertness.


