### The Mission Statement of St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we strive to grow in relationship with Him, live the Faith, and share His Good News with others.

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Am 6:1a, 4-7; Tm 6:11-16; Lk 16:19-31

The Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, is a powerful story with several key lessons. It is not so much

a literal account of the afterlife, but a condemnation of greed and indifference and a warning about the eternal consequences of a life lived for oneself.

The parable highlights a dramatic reversal of status in the afterlife. The rich man, who lived a life of luxury and ignored the suffering of the poor, finds himself in torment. In contrast, Lazarus, a poor beggar who suffered on earth, is comforted in "Abraham's bosom." This illustrates God's ultimate justice and the principle that those who

have received their "consolation" in this life through material wealth may face a different reality after death.

The rich man's sin was not that he was wealthy, but that he was callously indifferent to the suffering of Lazarus right outside his gate. He saw Lazarus every day, yet did nothing to help him. The "great chasm" that separates them in the afterlife is a physical representation of the spiritual and emotional chasm the rich man created in his own life. His lack of compassion became his eternal reality.

In the story, the rich man begs Abraham to send Lazarus back from the dead to warn his brothers. Abraham's response is a crucial point: "They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them." This emphasizes that people already have everything they need to know God and live a righteous life. God's Word is sufficient, and if someone will not listen to it, they will not be convinced even by a miracle.

As I shared with you last Sunday, at the Convocation Most Reverend Bishop Ronald Hicks shared with us his new Pastoral Letter "MAKE" and the reason why he was writing this letter. My feeling about the Pastoral Letter is that this letter came at just the right time. I am posi-

> tive that it would rekindle a fire in us and in the diocese that had been dimming.

> Before the promulgation of Bishop Hicks' letter we need to Reflect on the Great Commission Mathew 28:18-20. What is Jesus saying to you? What about those verbs "GO" and "MAKE"?

I urge you to revisit Bishop Conlon's letter "GO":

Take a moment to consider how we responded at that time. What fruit came of it?

Where might we have gone further? If you can read this certainly it will prepare fertile ground for what is to come from Bishop Hicks.... "MAKE"

Reflect prayerfully: Am I experiencing a pull toward Jesus, and what inspires that pull?

What ignites your inner spirit? What leads you to the church and sustains you in service and prayer?

This is the time of prayer; pray for our parish; pray for the Bishop; pray for our clergy, staff, and lay leaders. Pray for our priests in the diocese to assimilate and work for this cause. Invoke the Holy Spirit that this letter may enkindle us and to proclaim the Gospel. Once the letter MAKE is promulgated on September 30 – I ask that all parishioners read it and be a part of it. There are many steps to be taken after the promulgation of this let-

Mass next Sunday, October 5.


There will be a *CCW MEETING* on Monday, October 6 at 6:30pm. All women of the parish are welcome to attend.


