

Twenty-Third Sunday in OT Wis. 9: 13-18b; Phil 9b-10,12-17; Lk 14:25-33

Through today's Gospel, Jesus outlines the radical requirements of discipleship. He lays out three condi-

tions for anyone who wishes to follow him challenging the popular notion of an easy, comfortable faith.

The first and most jarring condition is that a person must "hate" his father and mother, wife and children, and even his own life to be Jesus' disciple. This is not a call to genuine animosity. Jesus used the Greek word 'miseo' and in a Jewish context, this word means "to love less" or to prioritize something less. Jesus is using hyperbole to make a critical point: nothing, not even the most

sacred human relationships or one's own life, should come before one's devotion to him. This challenges the deeply ingrained values of the family unit in first-century Jewish society. It doesn't mean we should harbor ill will toward our loved ones. Rather, it means that our love and loyalty to Jesus must be so absolute that, in comparison, our love for our family shall not prevent us loving him more than anything else. It is the ultimate test of a disciple is where their primary allegiance lies.

The second condition is to "bear his own cross" and follow Jesus. This phrase would have been instantly understood by the crowd. A person carrying a cross was on their way to execution. This is a powerful metaphor for being willing to embrace sacrifice, hardship, and even death for the sake of following Christ. It signifies a complete surrender of one's own will and a commitment to endure whatever suffering comes from living a life devot-

ed to God. For Jesus' followers, it signifies a willingness to die to oneself—to surrender one's own will, ambitions, and safety for the sake of the kingdom. It is a call to radical self-denial and a preparedness for hardship, rejection, or even martyrdom.

The final section of the passage uses two parables to illustrate the importance of "counting the cost" of discipleship. The first parable is about a man who begins building a tower but cannot finish it because he did not plan properly. The second is about a king who goes to war without first assessing if he can defeat his enemy. Both parables emphasize that following Jesus is a serious commitment that requires foresight and unwavering dedication. Jesus concludes by saying, "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple".

These parables are a call for intentionality and commitment. Jesus is encouraging people to think critically about what it truly means to follow him. True discipleship is not a casual decision; it requires careful consideration and a willingness to commit everything—family, possessions, and life itself—to the cause of Christ. The final verse, "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple," summarizes the total and unconditional surrender required.

In short, today's Gospel forces us to confront the seriousness of discipleship. It is not a path for the half-hearted but requires a complete reordering of our priorities, with Christ at the center of everything.


