#### The Exaltation of the Holy Cross Num. 21:4b-9; Phil 2:6-11; Jn 3:13-17

Today's Gospel passage contains some of Jesus' most profound teachings about salvation, his identity, and God's love for the world. This passage is part of a larger

conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus. Jesus says, "No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man." This statement highlights Jesus' unique identity. By referring to himself as the "Son of Man," Jesus uses a title with deep roots in the Old Testament, particularly the Book of Daniel, where the Son of Man is a divine, heavenly figure. Jesus is asserting his pre-existence and divine origin—that he is the only one with the

authority and knowledge to speak of heavenly things because he is from heaven. The phrase also points to his future ascension back to heaven after his earthly ministry. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him." The Israelites, after complaining against God, were being bitten by poisonous snakes. God instructed Moses to make a bronze serpent and lift it on a pole. Those who looked upon the serpent were healed and lived. This analogy is rich with meaning the bronze serpent was an object of healing and life, and by looking at it, the Israelites showed their faith and trust in God's provision. Similarly, Jesus predicts his own crucifixion—his "lifting up" on the cross. the cross, which appears to be an instrument of death, becomes the means

of salvation and eternal life for all who look to him in faith. Just as the Israelites were healed from physical death by looking at the serpent, believers are healed from spiritual death by looking to Christ's sacrifice. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that

whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." These verses encapsulate the very heart of the Christian gospel. The primary motivation for Jesus' mission is God's profound and unconditional love for the entire world. This love is not limited to a select group but is offered to all humanity. The expression of this love is the giving of his "one and only Son." This sacrifice highlights the immense cost and value of salvation. Jesus is God's unique and ultimate gift to humanity. The promise of eternal

life is available to "whoever believes in him." This emphasizes that salvation is not earned through works or merit but is received as a gift through faith. The Greek word for "believe" implies not just intellectual assent but a complete trust and reliance on Jesus. Today's gospel gives us a glimpse of the divine identity of Jesus and the purpose of his crucifixion as a means of healing and eternal life, all rooted in the boundless love of God for a world he sought to save, not condemn. It is a foundational text that beautifully connects God's love, Jesus' identity and mission, and the path to eternal life through faith.


