
The Peotone Senior Assistance Center serves clients by appointment only this Thursday, November 16, from 10am—3pm. This is part of our Respect Life

A few years ago, Steve McEveety, the producer of such Hollywood classics like, "The Passion of the Christ" and "Braveheart", was giving a lecture near New York City. He was speaking to a group of promising Catholic college students who wanted to pursue a career in the entertainment industry. During the question and answer period one of the students boldly asked one of the most obvious, and perhaps hardest, questions that can come up in that kind of setting. She said, "Mr. McEveety, what is your goal in life?" The successful Hollywood Producer paused and looked out the window for a moment. We can

just imagine what all the students were thinking at that time. They were probably going through their own list of personal goals, wondering how they would measure up in comparison. Then Mr. McEveety turned back to the audience and responded, matter-of-factly: "My goal in life? To get my kids into heaven. And I guess to get there myself, too."

You could have heard a pin drop; it was as if that were the absolute last thing they expected to hear. And yet, that's how all of us, as Christians, should answer that question. In one of the Eucharistic Prayers of the Mass we can follow the words the priest says: "that we may be counted in the company of Christ and be delivered from final damnation."

I personally always look for opportunities to improve things, to make them better. Spending more time with Scriptures, reading good spiritual books, having important conversations with friends and strangers, being more diligent in praying or celebrating Mass for the congregation, etc.

One thing I am looking to improve is to see more people in confessional. I do confessions usually on regular basis on Saturdays (3-3:45 pm) and Thursdays (7:30-7:55). I recently noticed a decrease of penitents coming to confession. Believe me, I am not looking for crowds to stand in line before confessional but, on other hand, I am not happy when there are so few people coming to ask Lord's forgiveness. I cannot force anybody to do that, but I want to encourage you to think about it, especially because of the upcoming Advent, which gives all of us time for reflection and reconciliation with God before Christmas. Use any opportunity to meet the Lord offering you freedom from sin and peace of clean conscience.


