


POPE FRANCIS' INTEN-TIONS for NOVEMBER 2023: For the Pope

The main tendency of our human nature is to think of ourselves as the center of the universe. And given the power of today's technology in our contemporary society this tendency to focus just on personal needs increases enormously. But we are not God, we are not the center of the world. We are dependent upon God and our job in this life is to know him, love him, and serve him. If we follow that pattern we find the happiness we desire, because this is what we were created for.



Squirrels were created to be cute and bury nuts. Humans were created to know, love, and serve God. God has given each of us a certain number of abilities and blessings and we are free either to squander them, burying them in the hole of self-indulgence, fear, laziness, and greed, or to use them as Christ would have us use them, which is the secret to happiness in this life and possessing eternal life to come.

Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta in that case always comes to my mind. One of the many stories of how she impacted the lives of the poor illustrates beautifully what it means to use our Godgiven talents well. Once she was staying with a community of sisters working with the Aborigines in Australia. While she was there, she visited an elderly man who lived in total isolation, ignored by everyone; his home was disordered and dirty. She told him, "Please let me clean your house, wash your clothes and make your bed." He answered, "I'm OK like this. Let it be." She said, "You will be still better if you allow me to do it." He finally agreed. So she was able to clean his house and wash his clothes.

While she was cleaning, she discovered a beautiful lamp, covered with dust; it looked like it hadn't been used in years. She said to the man, "Don't you light that lamp? Don't you ever use it?" He answered, "No. No one comes to see me. I have no need to light it. Who would I do it for?" Mother Teresa asked, "Would you light it every night if the sisters came?" He replied, "Of course." From that day on, the sisters committed themselves to visiting him every evening.

Mother Teresa left Australia; two years passed. She had completely forgotten about that encounter. Then she received a message from him: "Tell my friend that the light she lit in my life continues to shine still." In a sense, our life-mission is to do precisely that: to invest our talents in such a way that we light as many lamps as possible, in as many different ways as possible, bringing the Good News of God's trustworthiness, forgiveness, and love to all the people who are sick and dying with loneliness, selfishness, and regret. But to that we need to think of ourselves as servants of God totally dependent on His grace and mercy.

Bishop Hicks' Column

LAUNCHING OUR 75TH JUBILEE





A "JUBILEE" IS A SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY, marking a certain time period. For example, a twenty-fifth anniversary is universally recognized as a silver jubilee, whereas the fiftieth is known as the golden jubilee. This month, we are officially launching the 75th Anniversary of the Diocese of

Joliet, or the celebration of our diamond jubilee.

As they say, "diamonds are forever." This celebration gives us the opportunity to honor our past, commemorate our present, and look forward to the future with hope. Our year-long celebration will officially begin in December 2023 and end in December 2024. However, we have a few things happening in November that I would like to share with you and encourage your participation.

On Monday, November 6, 2023, we launched the first episode of a 14-part podcast series produced specifically for our 75th anniversary. In our pilot episode, Fr. Tom Paul, the chair of the Jubilee planning committee, and I talked about different ways that you can participate in our anniversary celebration. If you are a podcast afficionado, just listen on your favorite app by searching "Faith Into Action." Or you may try watching it on the diocesan YouTube channel. Either way, the links can always be found in the 75th Anniversary section of our website, **diojoliet.org/75th**, which can be read in English, Spanish, and Polish.

As we celebrate with great faith, hope, and love, I want to make sure we have many opportunities to pray together. A nine-day novena will begin on November 25, the Saturday after Thanksgiving. This Novena of Grace is based on the writings of the patron saint of our diocese, St. Francis Xavier. For daily prayers and devotions, visit the website or see your Sunday bulletin.

The novena concludes on December 3, 2023. On that same day we will host an event at the Blanchette Catholic Center at 1 p.m., where I will bless a new statue of St. Francis Xavier. He will beautifully welcome employees and visitors at the main entrance to our diocesan offices to remind us of our missionary call to share our faith with all people.

Then, for an entire year we will celebrate in ways that highlight my vision of catechesis, evangelization, and faith into action:

- We will promote **catechesis** through faith formation to help the next generations *know about* Jesus and the Church. Through novenas, prayer cards, and lesson plans, we will grow the knowledge of our faith for all ages. We are blessed that our celebration is occurring in harmony with the threeyear National Eucharistic Revival, which reminds us how the Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives.
- 2. We will also continue to **evangelize**, which is needed to truly know Jesus and *love* Him. True evangelization is realized when we believe in our minds, hearts, and souls that Jesus is real: He loves us, and we love Him. Through liturgies, prayers, media posts, podcasts, printed calendars, and commemorative books, we will actively **share** our faith and love of Jesus, who gives us eternal life through His life, suffering, death, and resurrection.
- 3. With catechesis and evangelization as our foundation, we will continue to put our **faith into action**. As Catholics, we *serve* the poor, the needy, and the marginalized. We speak for the unborn, the stranger, the abandoned, and those who are in most need of our care. As part of the 75th anniversary, I encourage all parishes to establish a day of service in the fall of 2024, responding to the various needs of each distinct community.

Jesus gave us such an incredible gift in the Church, and as baptized Christians, we are called to pass our faith on to the next generations. No one wants to belong to a Church that is merely surviving. Instead, we should have a burning desire to be a thriving Church that truly reflects God's light and God's love.

I encourage you to participate in some aspect of our 75th Jubilee during this next year. There is truly something for everyone, and I want each of you to know that YOU are a vital part of our celebration. So, together, rooted in Christ, let's live out the theme of our 75th anniversary: founded in faith, called to witness, and sent forth to serve!

LANZAMIENTO DE NUESTRO 75.º JUBILEO





UN "JUBILEO" ES UN ANIVERSARIO ESPECIAL que marca un período determinado. Por ejemplo, un vigésimo quinto aniversario se reconoce universalmente como jubileo de plata, mientras que el quincuagésimo se conoce como jubileo de oro. Este mes, lanzamos oficialmente la celebración del 75.° aniversario de la Diócesis de

Joliet, o nuestro jubileo de diamante.

Como suele decirse, "los diamantes son para siempre". Esta celebración nos brinda la oportunidad de honrar nuestro pasado, conmemorar nuestro presente y mirar al futuro con esperanza. Nuestra celebración, que se extenderá durante todo un año, comenzará oficialmente en diciembre de 2023 y finalizará en diciembre de 2024. Sin embargo, en noviembre tendrán lugar algunos acontecimientos sobre los que me gustaría hablarles y a los que les invito a participar.

El lunes 6 de noviembre de 2023 lanzamos el primer episodio de una serie de podcasts de 14 partes producida específicamente para nuestro 75.º aniversario. En nuestro episodio piloto, el Padre Tom Paul, presidente del Comité de Planificación del jubileo, y yo hablamos acerca de las distintas maneras en que ustedes pueden participar en la celebración de nuestro aniversario. Si son aficionados a los podcasts, sólo tienen que buscar "Faith Into Action" (Fe en acción) en su aplicación favorita y escuchar. También podrían intentar verlo en el canal diocesano de YouTube. En cualquier caso, siempre podrán encontrar los enlaces en nuestro sitio web, en la sección del 75.º aniversario, diojoliet.org/75th, presentada en inglés, español y polaco.

Mientras celebramos con gran fe, esperanza y amor, quiero asegurarme de que tengamos muchas oportunidades para rezar juntos. El 25 de noviembre, sábado siguiente al Día de Acción de Gracias, comenzará una novena de nueve días. Esta Novena de Gracia está basada en los escritos del santo patrono de nuestra diócesis, San Francisco Javier. Para conocer las oraciones y devociones diarias, visiten el sitio web o consulten el boletín dominical.

La novena concluye el 3 de diciembre de 2023. Ese mismo día, a la 1 p. m., en el Centro Católico Blanchette, celebraremos un acto en el que bendeciré una nueva estatua de San Francisco Javier. Él recibirá de una bella manera a empleados y visitantes en la entrada principal de nuestras oficinas diocesanas y nos recordará nuestro llamado misionero a compartir nuestra fe con todas las personas.

Luego, durante todo un año, celebraremos de distintas maneras, pero todas ellas enfocadas en resaltar mi visión de la catequesis, la evangelización y la fe en acción:

- 1. Promoveremos **la catequesis** a través de la formación en la fe para ayudar a las próximas generaciones a *conocer* a Jesús y a la Iglesia. A través de novenas, estampas con oraciones y planes de lecciones, haremos que el conocimiento de la fe se acreciente en todas las edades. Para nosotros es una bendición que nuestra celebración coincida con el Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional, una iniciativa de tres años que nos recuerda por qué la Eucaristía es fuente y cumbre de nuestras vidas.
- 2. También seguiremos evangelizando, lo cual es necesario para conocer verdaderamente a Jesús y amarle. La verdadera evangelización se realiza cuando, desde lo más profundo de nuestra mente, nuestro corazón y nuestra alma, creemos que Jesús es real: Él nos ama y nosotros le amamos. A través de liturgias, oraciones, publicaciones en los medios de comunicación, podcasts, calendarios impresos y libros conmemorativos, compartiremos activamente nuestra fe y amor por Jesús que, con su vida, sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección, nos da vida eterna.
- 3. Con catequesis y evangelización, nuestro fundamento, seguiremos poniendo nuestra **fe en acción**. Como católicos, **servimos a** los pobres, los necesitados y los marginados. Hablamos en nombre de los no nacidos, los forasteros, los abandonados y los que más necesitan de nuestros cuidados. En el marco de este 75.º aniversario, invito a todas las parroquias a establecer un día de servicio (en el otoño de 2024) para responder a las diversas necesidades de cada comunidad.

Jesús nos hizo un increíble regalo al darnos la Iglesia, y como cristianos bautizados, estamos llamados a transmitir nuestra fe a las siguientes generaciones. Nadie quiere pertenecer a una Iglesia que se limite tan solo a sobrevivir. Por eso, debemos tener el ardiente deseo de ser una Iglesia próspera, que refleje verdaderamente la luz y el amor de Dios.

Les invito a participar en algún aspecto de nuestro 75.° Jubileo este próximo año. Realmente hay para todos, y quiero que sepan que cada uno de USTEDES es una parte vital de nuestra celebración. Por eso, juntos, arraigados en Cristo, vivamos el lema de nuestro 75.° aniversario: "Fundados en la fe, llamados a dar testimonio y enviados a servir."
