President's Message: LOOKING BACK ON AN EVENTFUL YEAR

As we approach the end of 2025 it's good to recap the year's highlights. Our January dinner celebrated the Inauguration of Donald J. Trump as our 47th President. It didn't take long before President Trump issued a flurry of executive orders to implement his conservative agenda and kick off a first presidential 100 days like we've never seen before!

Our January dinner speaker was Tim Anaya, author of The California Left Coast Survivor's Guide. Attorney Joshua P. Thompson of the Pacific Legal Foundation

spoke to us in February on "Equality and Opportunity: A Civil Rights Strategy for the 21st Century" and explained what the PLF is doing to combat race-based DEI policies. In March, California State Assemblyman Carl DeMaio provided us with reasons for hope based on the work of Reform California. He also talked about how we could get involved in the petition drive to get Voter ID on the California ballot. In April, we heard from Mary Knox, Assistant District Attorney of Contra Costa County, who talked about the harmful impact on public safety brought about by the failure of our current District Attorney to enforce criminal laws in Contra Costa. Carlos Rodriguez spoke to us in May about how the Latino Action Alliance is increasing public policy awareness among Latinos, now the largest minority group in the U.S. Kevin Lincoln II, our June speaker, is presently running as a Republican candidate for

Congress. Kevin is an inspiring young man who was previously assigned to

Marine One when he served in the U.S. Marine Corps.

In July, we heard from former BART Director Debora Allen regarding BART's looming fiscal crisis. Our August speaker, Jean Follmer, Contra Costa GOP Central Committee member and former member of the Lafayette School Board, presented an excellent update on what is taking place in our local schools. Our September Meet & Greet hosted Kelly Perkins, the founder of Carson's Wings of Hope, a nonprofit focusing on education, awareness, and prevention of addiction to fentanyl and other opioids. In September, former Columbia University Trustee Kyriakos Tsakopoulos spoke on "Higher Education and Politics" and how his family is helping Hillsdale College establish a western campus. We also held a Tribute to Charlie Kirk at our September dinner in response to his tragic assassination. In October, distinguished U.C. Berkeley Law Professor John Yoo spoke to us about the "Supreme Court and the Trump Presidencies." We declared November Member Appreciation Month and celebrated old and new members, along with military veterans, at our November dinner.



Our speaker that night was Kristin Connelly, Contra Costa County Clerk Recorder and Registrar of Voters, who spoke on "Ensuring Election Integrity." This month we will have our club's General Meeting to elect club officers for 2026 and enjoy our annual holiday celebration with singing provided by the Campolindo High School's elite Chamber Choir Holiday Carolers.

And there has been so much more! Our club coordinated with the drive to recall soft-on-crime Contra Costa District Attorney Diana Becton. The Republican Club table was in action from May to October at Rossmoor's Friday Farmers Market, gathering signatures for ballot initiatives, registering voters, and providing information about our club and current events. In July, we celebrated passage of the Republicans' One Big Beautiful Bill. Several club members participated in a Walk for Wishes fundraiser to help sponsor a critically ill child's wish. The Republican Bridge Club was formed. And we have

CHINA IS FUNDING MAJOR ENVIRONMENTAL GROUPS

China, controlled by the Chinese Communist Party, has vowed to become the most powerful nation and leading economic power in the world. Some might think that to



accomplish these goals China would institute free market reforms to develop and strengthen its national economy. But China has a big problem with that strategy. Under Chinese Communist Party rule economic growth is highly regulated and restricted. Even though China has abandoned strict socialism, it is still a totalitarian economic and personal dictatorship. Thus, China's prevailing strategy has been to weaken its opponents so China will be stronger in comparison.

China has long deployed a philosophy of "Total War." This involves the use of all means possible to achieve its objectives. From actual combat, to spreading disinformation, to funding and promoting turmoil, and to promoting international economic sabotage. Although we may never really know, it is quite possible that China has even employed biological attacks.

The greatest risk America faces today is from grossly misled, seemingly well -intentioned, environmental extremist groups, many of which receive funds from Communist China. Policies that they are promoting, supposedly "to save the planet," will in fact have devastating consequences. A modern society's lifeblood is energy. If you turn off energy then transportation and modern agriculture would also come to an end. Modern communications, banking and commerce would be imperiled. The entire fabric of our modern society would unravel.

Our growing adoption of "green energy" is actually a fast-track to oblivion. Wind and solar are very costly, inefficient, and intermittent power sources. Trillions of dollars have been spent on wind and solar and the U.S. employs only a small percent of that very costly energy. The EIA.gov chart below lists "renewables" as including hydro and nuclear. But the left hates hydro and nuclear and doesn't even regard them as "green." Biomass generation means burning of wood, which is considered "green"—even though it causes very real pollution. That's how crazy environmental extremists are!



WHO VOTED FOR MAMDANI?

When the dust settled over the once great city of New York on Election Night 2025, Zohran Mamdani stood triumphant as mayor-elect with 50.4% of the vote. Former New York Democrat Governor Andrew Cuomo (running as an independent) came in second at 41.6%, followed by Republican Curtis Sliwa at 7.1%. Any sentient New Yorker could plainly see that Mamdani, running as the Democrat Party candidate, was an anti-American Marxist, Islamist, and anti-Semite, but the majority of them voted for him

anyway. What happened?

Admittedly, New York voters were not given a great choice. Cuomo was weighed down with a lot of personal and political baggage. He had resigned as governor in 2021 under a cloud of sexual harassment allegations involving 11 different women. Governor Cuomo was also guilty of badly mishandling the Covid crisis, under-reporting Covid deaths in his state and placing Covid-positive patients in elderly nursing homes with widespread fatal consequences. Not a record to feel very good about, but in the final analysis a vote for Cuomo in the New York mayor's race amounted to a vote for the status quo to avoid something far worse. There was also Republican Curtis Sliwa, but unfortunately he never gained any traction in a city where registered Democrats outnumber Republicans by over 2-to-1. As Election Day approached, President Trump pragmatically endorsed Cuomo as the only plausible alternative to transforming New York into Havana on the Hudson.

So who voted for Mamdani and why? Followup surveys reveal that Mamdani received his principal support from recent immigrants and young voters, especially young women. About half a million Muslims live in New York City and Mamdani also received the vast majority of their votes. With regard to recent immigrants, their strong support for this radical socialist is evidence that we are admitting an alarming number of newcomers to this country who are not grounded in core American values, such as economic freedom, meritocracy, condemnation of anti-Semitism, respect for law enforcement, and consequences for criminal behavior.

Seventy-five percent of young voters, aged 18 to 29, voted for Mamdani—while only 19% voted for Cuomo and 5% for Sliwa. Mamdani received his strongest support from young women in that age bracket: 84% of them voted for him, as compared to 64% of men the same age. Wall Street Journal columnist Allysia Finley, in an insightful article entitled "Grade Inflation Produced Mamdani's Proletariat," points out that New York City is heavily populated with young college graduates with high GPAs and degrees in such useful subjects as Social Justice or Ethnic Studies. They firmly believe that they are entitled to live in an expensive city like New York and enjoy a lifestyle commensurate with their inflated estimation of their worth, even if they can't find an employer who agrees with that assessment. Finley points out: "They believe their degrees aren't being adequately rewarded by the free market and blame capitalism. . . . Mr. Mamdani's supporters are rightly angry that the value of their degrees and earnings have declined. Instead of blaming their woes on capitalism or Israel, they ought to be protesting big government and greedy colleges."

Mamdani promised New Yorkers "affordability" and is quite clear about what he means by that: free public transportation, free childcare, \$30/hour minimum wage, city-owned grocery stores with cheap prices, and a city-wide rent freeze for as long as he holds office. For the majority of young adults with marginal job skills struggling to live well in one of the most expensive cities on Earth, Mamdani appeared to be making an offer they couldn't refuse. New York landlords would be conscripted to bear his rent freeze and "the rich" would have their already high taxes increased to pay for his other goodies.

These young people have no problems with Mamdani's radical socialism, anti-Americanism, and anti-Semitism. They have been indoctrinated by college professors and pubic-union school teachers to condemn traditional American values and free market capitalism and extol the virtues of socialism or flat-out communism. They have been taught U.S. history according to the tenets of "systemic racism," anti-capitalism, the historically dishonest "1619 Project" (published by the *New York Times*), and the gospel of

the "martyred" George Floyd. They know nothing of the atrocities carried out by the likes of Lenin, Stalin, Mao, Castro, Pol Pot, and Kim Il Sung. They don't know how capitalism works or that economists universally condemn rent control as destructive to the quality and quantity of affordable housing. And they certainly don't know that western democracies, such as France and Great Britain, which have moved in a soft socialist direction are in a state of slow but unrelenting economic decline. University of California Professor Emeritus John Ellis aptly notes "the fact that young people voted overwhelmingly for New York City Mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani, whose blend of leftist radicalism, anti-capitalism, loathing of the police and antisemitism, among other traits, marks him as the quintessential product of the American campus."

For an explanation of why Mamdani's socialist vision is particularly attractive to young women it is useful to look back at the "Life of Julia" slide show produced for Barack Obama's 2012 reelection campaign. (You can see it here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oqBjXP8RKho.) This notorious campaign ad featured an imaginary everywoman enjoying government provided benefits at 12 different stages of her life: Head Start programs help "Julia" at age 3; college aid benefits her at 17; Obama's Affordable Care Act covers "Julia" at age 22; the Democrat-sponsored Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act protects her at 23, Medicare covers her at 65, etc. The Democrat Party's playbook is to make young women feel economically vulnerable and present big government as a sort of benevolent husband providing for every stage of their lives. Young women aren't encouraged to look to their personal careers or marriage and family for economic comfort and security. Instead, they are convinced to rely upon a cradle-to-grave safety net that can only be provided by big government. Mamdani's campaign promises of free transportation, free childcare, higher minimum wage, and rent freezes simply expands upon the preexisting Democrat vision of ever bigger and more bountiful government at the expense of higher taxes, more regulation, and diminished personal and economic freedom.

New York City is no small prize for the Democrat Party's socialist cabal. It's the financial center of the United States and the world. It is also our nation's cultural center, historically home to many of America's greatest writers, artists, and musicians. When this once great city is laid to waste by Mamdani and his minions we will lose a great deal. And Mamdani is not alone. Many other unvarnished socialists now hold high political office, including Congresswomen Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez and Rashida Tlaib, as well as other members of the leftwing "Squad," Senator Bernie Sanders, and big city mayors including those in Chicago, Oakland, Los Angeles, and Seattle. Their numbers are growing and upon taking office they move aggressively to implement their extreme radical agendas.

Unfortunately, while moderates and conservatives haven't been paying enough attention, the radical left has made a Long March through K-12 and higher education, including at our most prestigious universities. President Trump's administration is presently making efforts to counter this, but far more needs to be done to reform our educational system at all levels. Otherwise we can look forward to many more Zohran Mamdanis and Alexandria Ocasio-Cortezes in our future.
