President's Message: WHEN IT COMES TO ILLEGAL TRUCK DRIVERS DEMOCRATS DON'T CARE ABOUT PUBLIC SAFETY

In April 2025, President Donald Trump signed an executive order directing his Secretary of Transportation to “rescind guidance that watered down the law requiring English proficiency for commercial drivers” in order to ensure that truck drivers “safely navigate roads, comply with regulations, and communicate effectively with authorities and employers.” This rule change came in response to a nationwide highway safety audit and a series of horrific fatal crashes caused by truck drivers from Latin America unable to read basic English-language road signs. Such crashes have involved illegal U-turns, wrong-way driving, or ignored runaway ramps. One might think that any sensible person would agree that drivers of big rigs must, as a matter of law, be able to read such common highway road signs as “Stop,” “Merging Traffic,” or “Do Not Enter—Wrong Way.” However, Democrat politicians are not sensible people and are psychologically incapable of passing up an opportunity to call someone a “racist.”

A highly revealing moment came during the April 22 TV debate featuring the leading contenders for California Governor when the candidates on stage were shown a video of a Highway Patrol officer administering a roadside English road-sign proficiency test to a Latino truck driver. The test consisted of displaying pictures of common English-language road signs and asking the driver—who appeared to be having a difficult time—to read aloud what the signs said.

Democrat Xavier Becerra was quick to accuse the Highway Patrol officer of “racial profiling” for testing the Latino trucker on his English proficiency. Becerra menacingly intoned that the Highway Patrol officer—not the English-deficient truck driver—“has some explaining to do.” Far left-wing billionaire activist Tom Steyer seconded Becerra’s moral outrage, piously repeating (twice for emphasis) that “racial profiling is illegal.” The other Democrat candidates on stage were quick to agree with Becerra and Steyer, finding fault with the Highway Patrol officer and notably ignoring the obvious public safety issue at stake.

Republican Steve Hilton, on the other hand, supported the officer’s action as a well warranted public safety measure. Hilton recounted the tragedy that befell a little girl who was placed in a coma and crippled for life by an accident caused by an illegal-immigrant driver’s inability to read an American road sign. However, the Democrats on stage showed no interest in that little girl or, for that matter, anyone else slain or seriously injured through the actions of an English-illiterate trucker. They completely ignored Hilton’s point and likewise completely ignored the obvious threat to public safety posed by a 40-ton truck under the control of a driver unable to comprehend basic road signs. Apparently—as far as those Democrats are concerned—if an illegal immigrant truck driver from Latin America unable to read English-language signs accidentally kills or maims an innocent victim, it’s the victim’s and their family’s tough luck.

In actuality it is extremely doubtful that the U.S. Supreme Court would condemn the type of public safety enforcement loudly denounced by Becerra, Steyer and the other Democrats on stage. In *Noem v. Vasquez Perdomo* (2025), the Supreme Court, voting 6 to 3, temporarily lifted lower-court restrictions that had previously barred federal agents from stopping individuals based on apparent race, ethnicity, or language. The Supreme Court's order permitted federal officers to consider a person's ethnicity—such as appearing Latino or speaking Spanish—as a relevant factor for questioning. In a concurring opinion, Justice Brett Kavanaugh quite reasonably noted that racial ethnicity may be weighed as a relevant factor in assessing reasonable suspicion for police detention under the Fourth Amendment. Kavanaugh stated that while “apparent ethnicity alone cannot furnish reasonable suspicion; under this Court's case law regarding

immigration stops, however, it can be a 'relevant factor' when considered along with other salient factors."

But the Democrat candidates for California Governor care as little for the actual state of the law as they do for highway safety. So why are Democrat politicians so firmly wedded to such an obviously absurd position? Two motives come to mind—both of which smack of bad faith. First, there is the perverse pleasure and perceived tactical advantage they derive from smearing their Republican opponents as "bigoted" or "racist."

Second, there is a more sinister motive: the idea that Democrat politicians see every illegal immigrant as a potential Democratic voter who must be kept happy with Democrat party positions. That is also most certainly the reason every Democrat candidate on stage supports free taxpayer-funded health care for all illegal immigrants in California. A future Democrat presidential administration would no doubt diminish border security (as happened during the Biden and Obama presidencies), grant amnesty, pass legislation to outlaw state voter ID laws, support birthright citizenship, and do whatever else it takes to effectively transform millions of illegal immigrants into potential Democrat voters. And that means that the Democrat Party must be seen as protecting and championing the cause of illegal immigrants at every turn and ultimately enfranchising the millions of illegal aliens who have been admitted into this country by the lax border policies of Presidents Obama and Biden.

In response to President Trump's April 2025 highway safety order, the federal Operation SafeDRIVE program has already removed hundreds of non-English proficient truck drivers from the road. But more needs to be done, particularly in "sanctuary states" like California. As Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton recently explained: "Americans were dying on our highways because of lax oversight by the Biden administration. President Trump and his administration are trying to clean this up. The American people should know the details of this regulatory disaster." And so should California voters when they consider who their next governor should be.



BE WARY OF MEASURE B

Measure B, appearing on your June 2 Primary Ballot, is a Contra Costa County ballot measure to authorize a countywide 0.625% sales tax increase for five years, estimated to generate \$150,000,000 annually to fund general county services.

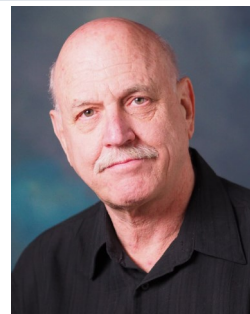

CALIFORNIA BANS THE SALE OF FLUORESCENT BULBS

Federal and state governments, prodded by environmental groups, have sought to reduce our use of energy. Enviros, acknowledging the total inadequacy of wind and solar power to meet modern energy needs, have come up with their “solution”—reduce the public’s electric consumption. To achieve this end regulators have for the past 20 years effectively banned incandescent light bulbs by specifying energy efficiency standards which those light bulbs cannot meet. Now most office and commercial buildings use mostly fluorescent lights, as do many homes. Even more energy efficient LED lights are available, but they are far more expensive.

Strangely, in California the sale of fluorescent light tubes and bulbs are now banned. Some existing fixtures can be used with LEDs, but those fixtures may need rewiring. The enviros’ complaint against fluorescents is that each bulb contains a very minute amount of mercury. (A standard compact fluorescent bulb generally contains 3 to 5 milligrams of mercury.) However, in California all landfills must be lined with plastic barriers to prevent leakage. So theoretically, leakage should not be a problem. As a further safeguard, state regulations require disposal of fluorescents to hazardous waste sites. And although we have been using such fluorescent lights since the early 20th century, I was unable to find any reported cases of related health problems.

Proponents of a return to incandescent lights cite their far lower upfront cost and the advantage of not having to change the many fixtures in their homes. Donald Trump, in his second term, has fought to reverse these regulations, but so far, to little avail. It would be nice if Trump could succeed in that worthy effort.

ROSSMOOR GATE PROCEDURES FOR NON-ROSSMOOR RESIDENTS

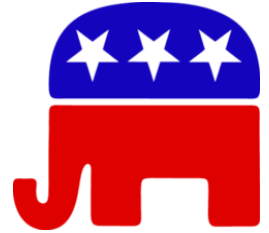

RESERVATIONS COORDINATOR WANTED

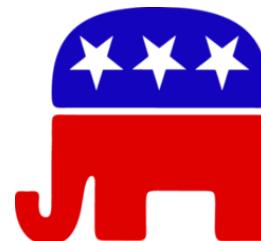

Communications

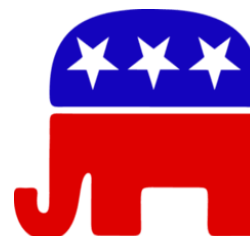
