REPUBLICAN CLUB CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR CANDIDATE DEBATE PARTY!





President's Message: DEMOCRATS SEND IN THE CLOWNS

Once upon a time we had Democratic leaders who took issues of war and peace seriously and wanted America to win. Democrats such as Franklin Roosevelt, Harry Truman, and John F. Kennedy. We may not have agreed with all of their decisions, particularly when it came to domestic matters, but those men understood that wars were serious affairs and the issues involved must be treated as such. These men would have been appalled at the behavior of present day Democrats such as Chuck Schumer, Gavin Newsom, Adam Schiff, and the like.

Ever since Donald Trump came down the escalator in 2015 to announce his candidacy for president, his Democrat opponents and their media allies have engaged in a nonstop torrent of smear tactics, propaganda, and character assassination all aimed at undermining him and his policies. And the fact that we are presently engaged in an armed conflict against a fanatical theocracy that has murdered over a thousand Americans in terrorist actions, has attempted to assassinate our president, has been striving for decades to develop illicit nuclear weapons, and regularly orchestrates Nuremberg-style rallies of mobs shouting “death to America” and “death to Israel” has not changed the behavior of partisan Democrats and their allies one bit.

One might think that this would be the moment for Trump’s political and media adversaries to undertake some intellectually honest soul searching regarding the well-being of our country and the grave threat Iran poses to us and to the world. Instead, they have carried out a barrage of propaganda and mindless talking points all directed at convincing our least-informed and most gullible citizens to reflexively oppose Trump’s policy.

Typical is the endless buzz about the lack of an “exit strategy” for a war that started just some weeks ago, on February 28. A recent Associated Press article began: “Senate Republicans voted down an effort Wednesday to halt President Donald Trump’s war against Iran, demonstrating early support for a conflict that has rapidly spread across the Middle East with no clear U.S. exit strategy”—implying that a President who begins an armed conflict without having an explicit “exit strategy” tucked away in his pocket is somehow akin to someone who starts to bake a cake without having a box of flour on hand. Of course, when Trump’s critics talk about having an “exit strategy” they don’t mean achieving total victory or, as Trump stated on March 6, obtaining Iran’s “unconditional surrender.” What the naysayers mean by an “exit strategy” is the cessation of military action upon achieving some predetermined goal well short of total victory, i.e., destruction of a weapons facility or driving an adversary back from a limited amount of territory.


Unfortunately, “exit strategies” often leave underlying conflicts unresolved and necessitate repeated military actions over time. The 1990-1991 Gulf War reached the defined “exit strategy” goal of driving Saddam Hussein’s Iraqi army out of Kuwait—but because Saddam’s malign regime remained in power, the U.S. was compelled to fight the Second Gulf War against Iraq in 2003 to completely vanquish Saddam from power. Then there has been Israel’s series of limited “exit strategy” wars against Hezbollah and Hamas in which Israel was repeatedly able to achieve limited victorious objectives, only to have to repeatedly come back and fight again whenever those terrorist groups renewed their hostilities. On the other hand, both the American Civil War and World War II ended with unconditional surrenders and the Confederacy, Nazi Germany, and Imperial Japan troubled America and the world no more.

Another foolish talking point is that Trump should have refrained from attacking Iran in light of the war’s potential impact on the global price of oil. Thus, this March 13 headline from the Wall Street Journal: “Trump Knew the Risk of Iran Blocking the Strait of Hormuz. He Still Went to War.” Well, of course, if Iran was attacked by the U.S. it was predictable that it would retaliate by acting to cut off the flow of oil

THE “CHICKEN LITTLE” EFFECT

We all remember the children’s story of Chicken Little who was hit on the head by an acorn falling from a tree. She started squawking: “The sky is falling!” All her friends were terrified and they tried to hide. Eventually everyone realized that nothing was happening and Chicken Little likely ended up in a cooking pot.

The lesson was that unfounded frightening claims always have a life expectancy, ending at the point where fear subsides to reality. We are at that point in the greatest scare ever, the Great Global Warming (aka: Climate Change) alarm. Wild claims of disaster exclaiming this have been cried out and extended over time. Ultimately, the real climate will have the last say. Polls show that the public is losing interest and losing fear along with it.

A brilliant marketing shift was made some years ago. As there was no warming, the issue was rebranded to “Climate Change.” That allowed any bad weather event to be offered as “proof.” This scare has had a long life since the political left adopted it.

Great scares are nothing new. In 1798 the English economist Thomas Malthus wrote that world populations were expanding geometrically while food production was only expanding arithmetically. Malthus concluded there would be mass starvation in just a few years. In 1968 a very similar prediction was made by Stanford Professor Paul Ehrlich, in his book “The Population Bomb.” Malthus and Ehrlich both scared a lot of gullible people, but in the end all of their dire predictions came to naught.



Film critic Roger Ebert described “A Family Thing” as “superior entertainment, warm-hearted and touching, and with some nice shadings in the performances.”

WHAT’S UP WITH ALL THE DIFFERENT DINNER CATERERS?






