RESEARCH FELLOW KRISTAIN FORS, OF THE INDEPENDENT INSTITUTE, WILL DISCUSS "CALIFORNIA'S UNAFFORDABLE HOUSING CRISIS" AT JANUARY 20 DINNER

Kicking off the new year, Independent Institute Research Fellow Kristain Fors will speak at our Republican Club dinner on January 20, in the Event Center's Tahoe Room. Kristian Fors is a Research Fellow at the Independent Institute and Director of the California Golden Fleece® Awards. His research focuses on public policy and economics, with an emphasis on government waste and inefficiencies in his home state of California. He earned a BA in economics from Utah State University, an MA in international relations from the Moscow State Institute of International Relations, and an MSc in behavioral science from the London School of Economics. Kristain has appeared on Fox News and Fox Business Network, and in *The Orange County Register* and the *San Francisco Chronicle*, among other venues.

As an undergraduate, Kristian was a Huntsman Scholar, a Koch Scholar, and an undergraduate research fellow at the Center for Growth and Opportunity. He also studied Russian at Saint Petersburg State University as an exchange student. Kristian has worked as a directorate intern for the U.N. Development Program's Nordic Representation Office in Denmark and as an English teacher in Russia.

President's Message: A CHANGING OF THE GUARD

Observant members of the Rossmoor Republican Club may have already noticed a few things that are different this month. For one thing, I am not appearing in my usual place in the Editor's View column of our newsletter. And instead of having one all-powerful President of the Republican Club you now have two "Co-Presidents"—former Membership Chair Mary Beth Hedge and me. This calls for an explanation.

When you think about it, our Republican Club does a lot of things. There's our premier offering, our club's monthly dinner events featuring a cocktail social hour, a guest speaker or live music entertainment, and a three-course plated dinner. Then there's our Meet & Greets, our Farmers' Market table, our monthly films, and biannual club lunches. There are also special events, such as our coming February 24 presentation by candidate for governor Steve Hilton. And there is a lot that goes on behind the curtain, such as working with our bank and food caterers, navigating Rossmoor's bureaucracy, state and federal filings concerning our 501(c)(7) status, and so forth. Of course, our club president doesn't need to personally accomplish all these things—our club is blessed with many dedicated Board members, Ambassadors, and other volunteers who assist in a myriad of ways. But our club president must do many things himself or herself and ultimately he or she is responsible for seeing that everything does get done. When I first joined the Republican Club in 2020, when my greatly-missed friend Harvey Gilbert was president, our board meetings were shorter and the agenda wasn't nearly as long. But times have necessarily changed.

Unfortunately our local political climate presents special problems. As demonstrated this year, Rossmoor presents a not-so-friendly environment for Republicans, which makes the job of our club president and board members that much harder. For the first time ever, our club encountered great difficulty in reserving Rossmoor's Event Center for our 2026 monthly dinners, notwithstanding that the Republican Club has an uninterrupted prior history of holding our monthly dinners in the Event Center ever since it first opened in 2014. The local reaction to the brutal assassination of Charlie Kirk was particularly telling in revealing a lack of human decency. No less than four letters appeared in the Rossmoor News complaining about Rossmoor's compliance with the U.S. Presidential directive to lower flags to half staff in Charlie's memory. One Rossmoor resident—a retired journalist!—even went to the trouble of appearing at the residents' forum at the October 13 Rossmoor Walnut Creek Policy Committee to grouse that lowering the flag in Charlie's honor might adversely impact Rossmoor's marketing program. It reminded me of complaints by racial bigots during the 1960s that permitting racial minorities to move into their neighborhoods might lower their property values.

Seventy-one percent of our neighbors in Contra Costa County voted in favor of Proposition 50, a mean-spirited scheme initiated by Governor Gavin Newsom to enhance his chances of securing the 2028 Democratic presidential nomination at the price of disenfranchising the 40% of Californians who generally vote Republican in the state that Newsom deceptively purports to govern in the best interests of its citizens.

So with two co-presidents we are trying something different this year to meet the various challenges we face. Mary Beth and I have known each other for many years, we get along well, and are committed to working together to bring our members engaging and exciting experiences in the year to come. 2026 is shaping up to be an exciting election year! Gavin Newsom is (thankfully) termed out so we have an open field competing to be California's next governor. Early polling on the governor's race shows two Republican candidates—author and former Fox News show host Steve Hilton and Roseville County Sheriff Chad Bianco—running very close to the lead against Democrat ex-congresswoman Katie Porter.

There is also the likelihood of promising ballot measures, including the Voter ID Initiative sponsored by Carl DeMaio's Reform California movement and a vote to recall soft-on-crime Contra Costa District Attorney Diana Becton.

One of our main goals will be to increase our club membership as well as attendance at our monthly dinners. We will be sharply focused on reaching out to potential members, renewing past memberships, and enhancing our membership experience to make it the very best it can be.

And before you ask, I also still hold the title of Editor of the *Rossmoor Republican* newsletter and my thoughts will be appearing in every newsletter—either here in the President's Message or with a new Editor's View. Many of our 2025 Board members have signed on for the year to come and we have also recruited some brand new Board members who show great energy and commitment to our club. Mary Beth and I both thank you for the faith you have placed in us and are determined to prove that the responsibility you have given us is well deserved.

And finally, a very special thank you to Chris Bratton, our outgoing President, for all she accomplished and overcame in a year filled with more than its share of challenges. It is a high tribute to Chris that as she retires as our 2025 Republican Club President the Board has decided that it will take two of us to replace her!






THE STRUGGLE TO MAKE PROPOSITION 36 WORK

In 2024, Proposition 36 was passed by an huge majority of 73% of California voters. It offered to correct the disastrous consequences of Proposition 47, passed in 2014, which downgraded theft of less than \$950 per event into a mere misdemeanor. Because of Proposition 47 police officers often didn't bother to arrest those looters because many leftist District Attorneys opted not to prosecute them.



There is no secret as to why Proposition 36 has been crippled. It is because California's supermajority Democratic Party has effectively defunded it. Another problem is that within the scope of Proposition 36 a criminal needs to have already been convicted of two prior theft-related offenses in order to presently be charged with a felony. Since petty thieves have been rarely charged by leftist District Attorneys, including Contra Costa's Diana Becton, few criminals can now be charged with a felony under Proposition 36. Shoplifters often stroll into California stores, sweep products into bags and casually walk out. Even if police do arrest them, unless more than \$950 is stolen police only issue a citation. There are no sentencing enhancements for multiple offenses.

If anyone doubts how devastating widespread looting has been in this state, go to YouTube and search for videos produced by "Metal Leo," among others. In recent years, California stores have suffered rampant shoplifting and even mass invasions by organized gangs of looters. Police have apparently been instructed not to interfere with such crimes. News footage shows police just standing by and watching as looters smash storefronts and walk away with armfuls of stolen goods. Authorities frequently know in advance what has been planned, since mass theft actions are often organized on social media.

As a result of this criminality, many major retail areas are now essentially abandoned. Looting in San Francisco has forced the closure of most Walgreens and many other stores. Criminals view looting as a low risk venture with fast and easy profits.

Such rampant lawlessness should not be tolerated. Local police departments are able to request mutual aid from nearby police and sheriff departments. Mass arrests, combined with heavy convictions and serious prison time, would convince many would-be offenders that committing a property crime is not worth the risk. Harsh prison sentences serve as a deterrent to potential lawbreakers.

Many California counties suffered because they elected leftist District Attorneys who forthrightly said they didn't believe in prosecuting "less serious crimes." Those policies worked in combination with voters being fooled into passing Propositions 47 and 57 to create an environment in which criminals ran amok. California's Attorney General has the power to decide on the names of ballot measures. In 2014, Proposition 47 was labeled as the "Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act." Proposition 57, another soft-on-crime ballot measure, which reduced prison sentences, was called the "Public Safety and Rehabilitation Act of 2016." The Attorney General who deceived the public by sanctioning those labels was Kamala Harris, subsequently promoted by Democrat voters to be Vice President of the United States. And our current California Attorney General, Ron Bonta, is just as bad as she was!

NEED A RIDE TO OUR MONTHLY DINNER? OR OFFER TO GIVE ONE?




