CHINA EXPERT JUNE GILLIAM WILL DISCUSS THE THREAT OF CHINESE INFLUENCE IN THE U.S. AT OUR MARCH 17 DINNER

Our guest speaker this month will be June Gilliam, a refugee from Communist China, who will talk about the major threats America presently faces by way of Chinese influence. Our Republican

Club dinner will be on March 17, in the Event Center's Tahoe Room. Social hour begins at 5:15 p.m., with dinner starting at 6:00 p.m. Speaker-only attendees arriving at 6:50 p.m. will be admitted for **FREE** to hear June's talk.

Born and raised in Shanghai, the largest city of China, June Gilliam graduated from one of China's top universities where she became a member of the Communist Party. In 1998, she came to the U.S. hoping to advance her career. Since 2008, she has been involved in speaking out to raise public awareness of China's systemic human rights abuses and growing influence in our nation. Silently and effectively, China has worked to undermine America through systematic attacks on our education system, economy, social media, and culture.

June holds a Master's degree in Management of Information Systems. She has been working for a Fortune 100 company in Silicon Valley for over a decade as a business operations management professional. June is a member of Santa Cruz Republican Women Federated and a volunteer for Friends of Shen Yun—a society of artists and fans inspired by the renowned New York-based Shen Yun Performing Arts. In her spare time June is an avid world traveler, sailor, and hiker. She currently resides in Santa Cruz with her husband and children.





President's Message: RECOMMENDED READING: *LAWLESS* BY ILYA SHAPIRO

Legal scholar Ilya Shapiro's recent book "Lawless: The Miseducation of America's Elites" should serve as a wake up call to anyone caring about the state of America's constitutional republic. Shapiro vividly describes the woke crisis in our nation's most elite law schools and law firms. What takes place in the legal community is critical to our future because lawyers and judges effectively control one third of our tripartite system of government, made up of the executive branch, legislative branch, and the judiciary. Alexander Hamilton famously described the judiciary as the "least dangerous" branch of government. But just because the judiciary is the "least dangerous" of the three branches doesn't mean that it can't be highly dangerous. The federal judiciary, including the Supreme Court, has the final word on how our laws are interpreted and whether any particular law or executive order is unconstitutional. A judiciary which has been corrupted by diversity, equity, and inclusion ("DEI") ideology or Critical Race Theory ("CRT") can be very dangerous indeed.

Shapiro begins by describing his own personal horror story involving his encounter with left-wing cancel culture. In early 2022, Shapiro, a well-known conservative legal scholar, was under contract—but had not yet begun work—to serve as a lecturer and executive director at Georgetown Law's Center for the Constitution. On January 26, he penned a late-night tweet criticizing President Joe Biden's breaking announcement that he was committed to nominating a black woman to replace retiring Supreme Court Justice Stephen Breyer. Shapiro's tweeted that Sri Srinivasan, Chief Judge of the Washington D.C. Court of Appeals, would be the very best selection for a liberal Supreme Court justice and that by limiting his choices to black women Biden would end up picking a "lesser" nominee than Judge Srinivasan. An immediate left-wing firestorm erupted accusing Shapiro of racism and demanding that he be fired from Georgetown Law before he even started teaching. Seeing this reaction the next morning, Shapiro deleted his tweet and apologized for any "inartfulness," while reaffirming his view that Biden should consider all qualified candidates, regardless of gender or race, to replace Breyer on the high court—a position supported by 76% of the American public.

No matter. Left-wing activists had taken screen captures of Shapiro's now-deleted tweet and it had gone viral. Students and faculty at Georgetown Law—one of our nation's most prestigious law schools—demanded that Shapiro be fired, claiming they had already been seriously harmed by Shapiro's "racist tweet" and couldn't possibly "feel safe" in his presence.

Georgetown immediately placed Shapiro on administrative leave while the law school's DEI department conducted an intense four-month investigation. Shapiro was repeatedly called in for questioning regarding: 1) the meaning of his tweet, 2) whether he fully comprehended all the pain and suffering his "racist tweet" had inflicted upon the Georgetown Law community, and 3) how he could possibly imagine being an effective instructor after this outrage.

On March 1, 2022, while all this was all this was going on, Shapiro was shouted down at UC San Francisco Law School (Kamala Harris' alma mater) when he showed up for a student Federalist Society event where he was scheduled to debate a progressive law professor about "The Battle Over Justice Breyer's Seat." Shapiro was met at UC San Francisco by activist members of the school's Black Law Students Association. When Shapiro took the lectern, the activists—dressed in all black and carrying signs denouncing Shapiro as a racist—erupted into loud chants of "black lawyers matter" and pounded the table to drown him out. Shapiro's repeated attempts to begin speaking were silenced by angry yells from the students, who unleashed a stream of profanity and insults as he stood silently at the front of the room. Shapiro finally gave up and left. The debate never took place. Although several faculty members voiced their support for the activists who shut down the Federalist Society event, the UC San Francisco

administration subsequently sent out a message to the entire student body, reiterating its "commitment to protecting free speech" and saying that "the act of silencing a speaker is fundamentally contrary to the values of this school as an institution of higher learning." However, no disciplinary action was taken against any of the disruptive law students.

Georgetown Law ultimately concluded that—although Shapiro's tweet was irredeemably "racist" and inflicted "significant" harm to the "Georgetown community"—the tweet had been sent out before Shapiro was technically a Georgetown employee and the university thereby lacked jurisdiction to punish him for it. Georgetown ordered Shapiro to immediately report to work, but under woke probationary conditions that were so onerous that Shapiro immediately tendered his resignation. He is now employed at the Manhattan Institute, a prominent conservative think tank.

Unfortunately, Shapiro's experience is not unique—it is all too representative of what is going on in our nation's law schools. The vast majority of law school faculty and administrators lean left and many self-identify as extremely left. Georgetown Law, which is typical, has three nonprogressive faculty members out of a total of 153. Leftist administrators and faculty strive to preserve those political imbalances, working to prevent the hiring of conservative law professors and seeing to it that existing conservative instructors are marginalized or fired. Apart from his own story, Shapiro describes similar incidents involving University of Pennsylvania law professor Amy Wax, Ohio Northern law professor Scott Gerber, and many others. Conservative guest speakers are routinely "cancelled"—harassed, heckled, and shouted down at law schools by noisy activists who are very rarely punished. Most cancellation incidents take place at the most elite schools—such as Harvard, Stanford, and Columbia—which unfortunately is where our nation's next generation of leaders, including Supreme Court Justices, lower court federal judges, and prestigious law firm heads—are likely to come from.

Law schools house well-staffed DEI departments that effectively act as leftist commissars, enforcing woke political orthodoxy upon students and faculty alike. This includes enforcing harsh censorship against anyone who offends their sensibilities and mandating indoctrination for all students and faculty covering "anti-racism," "implicit bias," "white supremacy," and the like. Shapiro decries that law students are effectively taught to question the legitimacy of the American legal system itself as irrevocably imbued with racism, sexism, patriarchy, etc. He describes "a pernicious dynamic . . . reminiscent of the Chinese Cultural Revolution, in which students publicly shame and otherwise humiliate professors to scare them into ideological obedience." Faculty members who inwardly don't approve of what is going on keep their heads down and their language circumspect out of fear, bearing in mind they have careers to protect, families to support, and pensions to preserve.


Elite corporate law firms have also succumbed to the woke mind virus. Recent law school grads who join major law firms are quick to demand that the firms adhere to the same radical left-wing ideology that they imbibed in their college and law school days. They bully the firms to publicly denounce conservative Supreme Court decisions and drop politically disfavored clients. Partners in prestigious law firms have been ostracized and effectively forced to leave after expressing opposition to abortion rights or politically incorrect views on gay or transgender issues. Big law firms that patted themselves on the back for providing pro bono representation to accused terrorist Guantanamo detainees in the wake of 9/11 adamantly refuse to be hired by U.S. oil companies, gun manufacturers, or religious groups seeking protection from pro-abortion mandates. Most elite firms also maintain DEI committees and require their lawyers to be indoctrinated with DEI and "anti-racist" propaganda masquerading as continuing legal education.

In summary, the radical left ideology dominating our most prestigious law schools is brutally intolerant of dissent, violently hostile to freedom of speech and thought, irredeemably racist, and totalitarian in its mindset and actions. It represents the complete antithesis of the values requisite to sustaining our nation as a constitutional republic. If a future U.S. Supreme Court were to ever contain a majority of these present-day Jacobins, possessing the power to interpret our laws and constitution, it will mean the end of America's existence as a free and prosperous nation. A handful of Republican-led states, such as Texas, Florida, and Georgia, are taking much needed action to purge DEI bureaucracies and policies from their local colleges and universities—but far more needs to be done on a nationwide basis to reform our educational system, including our law schools, before it becomes too late.

“CLEAN” ENERGY

Calling conventional energy "dirty" is playing into the left's global warming fraud. One should consider that there are two gases on earth which are necessary for life. 


