## REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE FOR LT. GOVERNOR GLORIA ROMERO WILL SPEAK AT OUR MAY 19 DINNER

Our guest speaker this month will be Gloria Romero, Republican candidate for California Lieutenant Governor. Our Republican Club dinner will be on Tuesday, May 19, in the Event Center. Social hour begins at 5:15 p.m., with dinner starting at 6:00 p.m.

Gloria Romero is a former California State Senator and a nationally recognized leader on education reform and school choice. Gloria earned a PhD in psychology from the University of California, Riverside, and went on to serve as a professor at Cal State Los Angeles. First elected to the State Senate in 2001, she represented East Los Angeles and the San Gabriel Valley and quickly rose through the ranks, becoming the first woman to serve as California's Senate Majority Leader. Gloria was widely regarded as one of the Legislature's most effective and forceful leaders. As Chair of the Senate Education Committee, she became one of the most influential voices shaping California education policy. Gloria has been a consistent advocate for charter schools, parental empowerment, and merit-based education reform. She believes education is the central civil rights issue of our time.

In 2024, citing the Democratic Party's abandonment of working-class families and parental rights, Gloria left the party and became a Republican. Gloria is now running for Lieutenant Governor of California in order to continue her legacy of fighting for quality education reform, as well as to reduce our state's cost of living so that we can restore opportunity, affordability, and the California Dream.

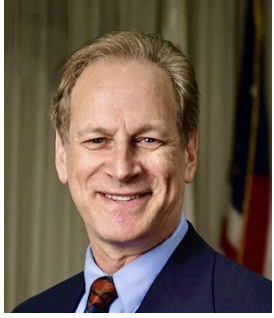

## President's Message: THE DEMOCRAT CIRCUS COMES TO TOWN

For the past 15 years, California politics have pretty much been a farce but the current governor's race, featuring a gaggle of lackluster power-hungry Democratic candidates, each less qualified than the other, has brought California politics to a new low. We at the Republican Club are working to give our members a front row seat for the festivities, hosting live events for Republicans Steve Hilton and Chad Bianco and holding a Debate Party on April 22 to watch the six leading candidates square off in a televised debate. There will be more such events to come, so stay tuned.

The early Democrat frontrunner in the governor's race was former Congresswoman Katie Porter. Porter made a name for herself haranguing corporate CEOs and Trump appointees at congressional hearings, before launching an unsuccessful U.S. Senate bid in 2023. However, Porter's gubernatorial campaign floundered in October 2025 when two unflattering video clips received widespread play. The first showed Porter berating a TV journalist and threatening to stalk out of an interview upon being asked how she could appeal to Californians who had previously voted for Donald Trump. The second revealed Porter cursing out one her staffers for getting in the way of a camera while Porter was composing a video clip. Porter already had a reputation for being somewhat of a jerk, and those videos cemented it. Other Democrat political figures smelled blood in the water and leapt into the California gubernatorial scrum. Prominent among them were Congressman Eric Swalwell and billionaire activist Tom Steyer.

By early 2026 there were seven Democrat politicians in the race and party leaders were beginning to worry. Under the rules of California's so-called "jungle primary" (created by a 2010 ballot initiative) the top two vote getters in the state's June primary advance to the November General Election—even if this results in a final runoff between two Democrats or two Republicans. California's jungle primary system was sold to voters with the idea it would produce more moderate centrist candidates and policies, but so far it has worked to produce gamesmanship and chaos—such as the specter of Adam Schiff running ads in his 2023 Senate primary campaign aimed at promoting Republican Steve Garvey—rather than fellow Democrat Katie Porter—to serve as Schiff's rival in the November runoff.

Democrat power brokers now feared that the combination of a crowded Democratic field with no clear frontrunner and two strong Republican candidates, by way of former Fox News host Steven Hilton and Riverside Sheriff Chad Bianco, could effectively end up completely shutting Democrats out of the General Election and create the certainty of (horrors!) the first California Republican Governor since 2011. Their solution (believe it or not) was to inject another Democratic candidate into the race. Their selection was San Jose Mayor Matt Mahan, portrayed as a moderate voice in a Democratic pack that tilted hard to the left—perhaps someone who could say with a straight face: "Look at me, I'm not as crazy as these other Democrats." Unfortunately, that message hasn't resonated so far. And although wealthy Democrat tech bros have provided Mahan with a sizable war chest, his candidacy has yet to catch fire and he currently polls at about 5%.

The first sign that the Democrat clown show would descend from low-brow comedy to complete farce came with the Governor Candidates' Debate scheduled for March 24. A selection criteria developed by a USC professor, based on a mix of polling and campaign receipts, produced a debate field composed of six white candidates and the exclusion of all four candidates of color. Of course, this prospect outraged the ever race-sensitive Democrat leadership and the debate was abruptly cancelled just hours before it was set to begin, leaving Steve Hilton fuming, en route, at the San Francisco airport.

Then there was Eric Swalwell, who withdrew from the gubernatorial race and resigned his seat in

Congress in early April, following allegations that he had drugged and raped several female staffers and acquaintances. That was a spectacular fall from grace for Swalwell, who had been a close congressional ally of Nancy Pelosi and, up to that time, the top-polling Democrat candidate for governor. For years, Democrats had lauded Swalwell because he was highly useful to them—a rabid attack dog who could always be counted on to savage their political foes and leap to the forefront of any leftwing lynch mob. Given the brazenness of Swalwell’s alleged sexual assaults, the number of victims, and the rumors swirling about him for over a decade, it defies credulity that leading Democrats such as Pelosi and Adam Schiff—who worked closely with Swalwell, including during his role as a Trump impeachment manager—had not been aware of his sexual predations for many years. But Swalwell was only useful to them until he wasn’t. The turning point came with Swalwell’s unexpected announcement, on the Jimmy Kimmel show, that he would be entering the California governor’s race. That created the unacceptable risk that Swalwell’s sexual scandal would break after he had emerged from the June primary as the sole Democrat finalist facing off against a Republican opponent in the November General Election. The solution to the Democratic Party’s dilemma was to blow the whistle on Swalwell immediately, while there was still time for another Democrat frontrunner to emerge. No matter the ultimate outcome in November, it is all to the good that Swalwell has finally been exposed as a serial sexual predator, rapist, and disgrace to his former office, with the result that Nancy Pelosi’s pet monster is destined for political oblivion and likely even prison. By itself, that is a clear victory for decency and our nation’s moral hygiene.

In the aftermath of Swalwell’s exit from the race, Latino Democrat Xavier Becerra gained traction in the polls, which allowed DEI-compliant broadcasters to move forward with a April 22 TV debate featuring Hilton, Bianco, Becerra, Porter, Steyer and Mahan. Republicans Hilton and Bianco performed very well, explaining how decades of Democrat dominance has produced terrible results for California: sky-high taxes, dismal educational outcomes, and the worst numbers for poverty, unemployment, homelessness, and energy prices in the nation. Porter apologized for abusing her campaign staffer, but her debate performance did little to salvage her sinking prospects. Steyer apologized for the nth time for having made his vast fortune through investments in private prisons, coal mines, and oil companies, but likely gained ground by casting himself as the most radical progressive on stage. Becerra demonstrated his bona fides as the consummate Democratic political hack, blaming California’s high gas prices on President Trump’s two-month-old war in Iran—notwithstanding that California has had outrageously high gas prices for decades and the state’s gas prices are invariably almost two dollars higher than the national average. And Becerra accused a Highway Patrol officer of “racial profiling” by way of questioning a Latino truck driver regarding his ability to read English-language traffic signs—while completely blowing past the obvious threat to public safety posed by a 40-ton truck under the control of a person unable to comprehend basic road signs.

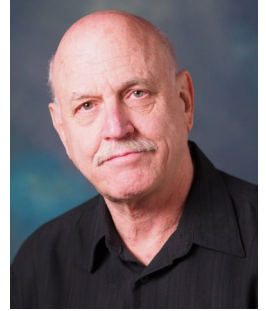
Steyer now seems to have the edge among the Democratic contenders. It’s true that in his prior life as a hedge fund mogul he invested heavily in things, such as private prisons and fossil fuels, that progressives view as politically odious. Steyer doesn’t deny that past history, but proclaims that he has seen the light and now deploys his ill-gotten gains to further progressive causes, like seeking to impeach President Trump, combating “climate change,” raising taxes on “big tobacco,” and reducing prison sentences. He supports big tax increases on corporations and high-earners. Steyer has even threatened mass arrests of federal ICE agents if he is elected Governor. That’s a crazy idea and very likely unconstitutional, but also one certain to endear him to the rapidly growing left wing of the Democrat party. Steyer has veered so far to the left that, notwithstanding his billionaire status and prior toxic investments, he has been endorsed by Bernie Sanders’ Our Revolution group! Steyer may not be a spirited debater, but from a progressive point of view he has avoided unforced errors and ensured that none of the other Democrats can position themselves to the left of him. Now, in possession of Bernie Sanders’ stamp of approval, Steyer likely has the momentum needed to be one of the two final contestants in the November General Election.

If I were to make a prediction right now, I would go with Steyer and Hilton facing off in November and, optimistically, I could envision the state’s corporate interests rallying behind Hilton to stave off California’s going the way of Castro’s Cuba or Mamdani’s New York City. But given the wackiness of our governor’s race, my take could very well be completely different by next week.

# THE LOOMING U.S. FISCAL CRISIS

The U.S. national debt of \$39 trillion dollars is something most people have little understanding of or concern about. Democrats will always say we need higher taxes and that there are no places to cut (except, of course, military spending). Every year we add almost \$2 trillion in additional debt. We are currently paying more in interest on our debt than we are paying for national defense. And this is during an era of comparatively low interest rates. Democrats also tell us, “We owe this money to ourselves, so how can this be a problem?” This is about as logical as folks deeply in debt saying, “We just owe this to each other. How can that be a problem?”

The fact is that a large segment of U.S. bond purchasers have been foreign governments, predominantly China and Japan. Persistent U.S. inflation has caused these government to stop buying our debt and even begin liquidating their U.S. bond holdings. There is just not enough of a market for the amount of massive new U.S. debt piled on each year. So our deficit is being financed by simply printing more money. Actually, printing on this scale is not even possible, so the new money is being created electronically. The new money is being “backed” by additional bonds that pay market-rate interest. Despite the fact that these interest payments go directly back to the Treasury, the increase in our money supply is very real and very inflationary.

Money is a commodity, just like any other. Scarcity and demand for any commodity drives up the price. If there is a lack of demand or too much supply, the price of a commodity drops. If the quantity of money is increased without a corresponding increase in goods and services, the value of our currency declines. Inflating the money supply brings about inflation, resulting in rising wages and prices.

## *The End Game:*

Historically, when a country has a national debt of over 125% of GDP (which we are fast approaching at 123%) a death spiral is very likely to occur. In 2023, interest alone on the debt was about 18% of our total national revenue. Our U.S. national defense budget was about 13% of national revenue. Every new increase of our deficit needs to be financed by an ever greater debt burden. Eventually, this will lead to very hard choices: drastic cuts in government or continuing to add ever more debt, along with printing more money to cover the shortfall. We can always hope things turn out differently this time, but it never does. A few historical examples of runaway national debt are Germany’s Weimar Republic and the debt crises of Argentina and Venezuela.

There is a widespread popular economic idea these days called “Modern Monetary Theory.” This idea is really not modern at all—it is just a rebranding of old-time Keynesian semi-socialist economics. John Maynard Keynes’ ideas are highly attractive to those on the left because they hold that heavy government involvement in the economy is necessary and beneficial. Modern Monetary Theory argues that increased government spending grows the economy and does not necessarily cause inflation. That is a very dangerous and destructive idea, but many on the left would love to carry out that dangerous experiment.

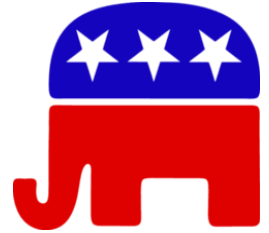

# RESERVATIONS COORDINATOR WANTED

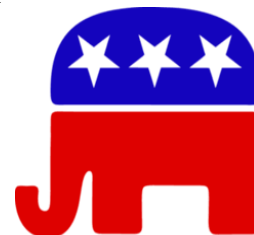

## Communications

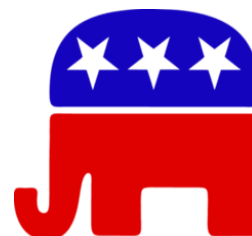

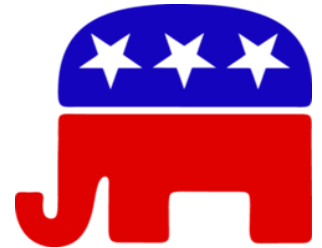


## ROSSMOOR GATE PROCEDURES FOR NON-ROSSMOOR RESIDENTS

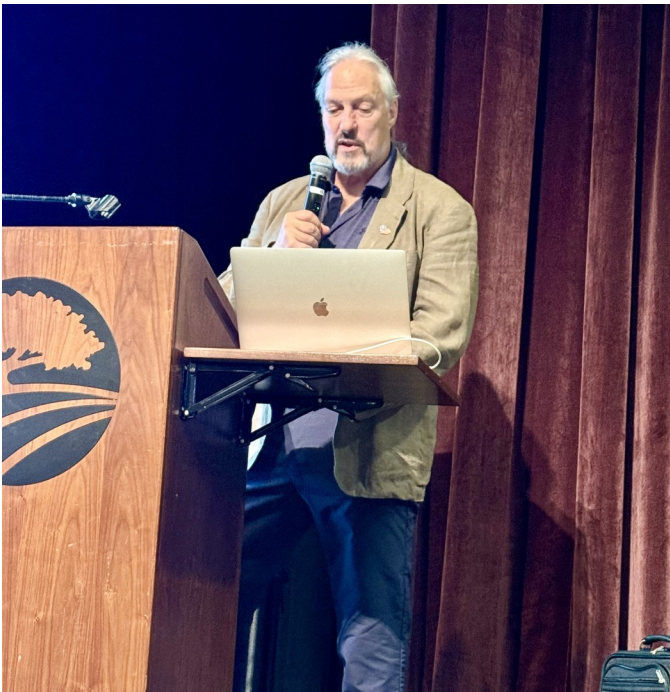


## MAY VOLUNTEER OF THE MONTH
