A message from our pastor Fr. Robert Ni Ni, MF

Today's readings remind us of our divine call to repentance, acceptance, and holiness. Our faith is so much more than traditions and rituals. Faith is meant to be lived out every day.

Freeing Us of Disease

The first reading describes the precautions against leprosy during the days of Moses and Aaron. These practical precautions separated the diseased people from the healthy. This reading from the Book of Leviticus leads us into the Gospel message. Jesus heals a leper, freeing him from both the disease and the social isolation that lepers faced.

Embracing Society's Outcasts

St. Paul, in the second reading, urges us to be imitators of Christ and to live for God's glory. He also encourages us to be sensitive to people who are different from us and not pass judgment. Throughout the Gospel, Jesus models to us His call to welcome and embrace the outcasts of society.

Healing Our Spiritual Life

Think about the walls you have built around your life. How can you open your heart to welcome people that society has cast aside? We may not interact with Jews or Greeks like St. Paul mentions, but we are likely to interact with people of different religious, economic, and social classes. Likewise, it is unlikely that we are ostracized from the community by a physical condition like leprosy. However, spiritual leprosy can separate us from the love of God and others.

Receiving Forgiveness

Whenever we receive Sacrament of Reconciliation with repentance, we are cleansed from spiritual leprosy. When we repent, God assures us of His forgiveness and spiritual cleansing. At the words of absolution, we hear God saying, "Your sins are forgiven, and you are clean."

Reflecting God's Mercy

In your life, strive to embody God's love for everyone, no matter their circumstances. By doing so, you reflect His mercy and compassion and bring joy to others.



LENT: IT'S MEANING

Lent begins on ASH WEDNESDAY (February 14, 2024) and ends on the twilight start of Holy Thursday evening Liturgy. Mass on Ash Wednesday will be at 7:00 a.m. & 5:30 p.m. With ASHES—the solemn reminder of our mortal limits and the church's call to conversion, the Lenten season begins. Its forty days are for remembering and

OUR PARISH KEEPS LENT becoming what our baptism meant us to be. This season invites the whole parish community and every member to put aside so much of the

busyness that occupies us, calling us to slow down to an **intentional** life. We can keep Lent fruitfully only if we give it a priority and a preference above all else.

AS A PARISH WE OBSERVE LENT

In practice, Lent calls us to the discipline of **prayer**, **fasting**, and **almsgiving**, providing us with opportunities for conversion: our ongoing personal transformation/ conversion. In this way, we answer to the ceaseless claim of our baptism, shaping our lives in keeping with the faithful heart we know and celebrate in Jesus. This, then, is the work of Lent...and the journey begins with ashes: dying that we may rise with Christ as Easter's promise!

LENTEN REGULATIONS and DIOCESAN INSTRUCTIONS for the OSERVATION OF LENT:

FASTING: In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both ASH Wednesday (February 14 and GOOD FRIDAY (March 29). To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (except water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT: Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on ASH Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

EASTER DUTY: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled, for a just cause, at some other time during the year. This period is extended to include all the weeks of Lent and the Easter Season up to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity Sunday (May 26).

LENTEN PRACTICES: The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services (March 12th 6pm), and receive sacramental absolution; to take part in public and private exercises of piety Lenten Retreat (March 19th 6:00-7:30pm), give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor; to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink, and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.
