Today is the first Sunday of Lent, and this 40-day liturgical season is a big deal. After all of the fun of Mardi Gras, we started Lent with fasting and abstinence on Ash Wednesday. We abstain from meat every Friday during Lent, and we await a big celebration on Easter Sunday. This liturgical season follows the rhythm of Jesus' life - living, dying, and coming back to life.

During Lent, we think about the wrong things we do in our lives. We see where we mess up in our relationships, where we let others down, and where we don't do right by God. Sin isn't just a word; it's real. We see it in the pain and injustice all around us - in wars, in people being treated unfairly, and in hunger. We might think our sinfulness is small compared to others' sins, but every little wrong adds to the bigger problem of sin in the world. This Lent, spend some time reflecting on the wrongs you commit. Ask God for the strength to resist these temptations, repent, and avoid these sins in the future.

Sincerely Ask for Forgiveness

Lent isn't just about admitting our sinfulness. It's also about asking for forgiveness with a sincere heart, apologizing to those we offend and apologizing to God. When we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we express our sorrow, repent, and ask God for forgiveness. God forgives us through sacramental absolution, just like Jesus forgave everyone, even from the cross. Grow Stronger in Faith for 40 Days This Lenten season, grab hold of the idea of forgiveness and starting

fresh, knowing how much God loves us, shown through Jesus' sacrifice. Let's use this time to pray, repent, and ask forgiveness. May all of us come out stronger in our faith after 40 days, to more joyfully celebrate Easter.

Like the way the world changed after Noah's flood, Lent is a time for fresh starts and second chances. God gives us lots of opportunities to say sorry, to change, and to believe in the Good News. Lent is a time to reflect upon how we live out our spiritual journey and what changes

AS A PARISH WE OBSERVE LENT

In practice, Lent calls us to the discipline of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, providing us with opportunities for conversion: our ongoing personal transformation/ conversion. In this way, we answer to the ceaseless claim of our baptism, shaping our lives in keeping with the faithful heart we know and celebrate in Jesus. This, then, is the work of Lent...and the journey begins with ashes: dying that we may rise with Christ as Easter's promise!

LENTEN REGULATIONS and DIOCESAN INSTRUCTIONS for the OSERVATION OF LENT:

FASTING: In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both ASH Wednesday (February 14 and GOOD FRIDAY (March 29). To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (except water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT: Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on ASH Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

EASTER DUTY: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled, for a just cause, at some other time during the year. This period is extended to include all the weeks of Lent Lenten Weekdav and the Easter Season up to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity Sunday (May 26).

LENTEN PRACTICES: The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services (March 12th 6pm), and receive sacramental absolution; to take part in public and private exercises of piety Lenten Retreat (March 19th 6:00-7:30pm), give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor; to practice voluntary self-denial, Lenten Weekdav especially regarding food, drink, and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.
