Bishop Silva requests every parish to place the following announcement in its weekly bulletin for three consecutive weeks:



In order to safeguard the sacredness of the Holy Eucharist, Bishop Silva has forbidden that the Eucharist be given to anyone presenting a pyx in the Communion line. Only those who are authorized by the parish priest to take Holy Communion to the sick may receive the Eucharist from the priest after the Communion of the faithful, and never during the Communion procession.

After initially thinking that Eli was calling, Samuel learned to recognize and respond to the voice of God. Like Samuel, we are encouraged to open our ears and hearts to God's gentle calling. In the midst of the noise of the world, we are encouraged to listen to the whispers of the divine in our daily lives. If we take the time to be still and listen to God speaking in our hearts, we can discern God's voice.

In the second reading, Paul urges us to honor God, not just with our mind and heart, but with our body as well. Our physical bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, and we can glorify God by the way we use and treat our bodies. By living in purity and holiness, we recognize the sacredness of ourselves. By responsibly and honorably caring for our bodies, we become more fully alive in God's divine presence and ready to serve the Lord.



"What are you looking for?" asks Jesus of the two disciples who come to see who he is and what he is about. They are Jesus' first words in John's Gospel, and that's what the entire Gospel of John is about, an answer to that piercing question.

I spent the week living with that question, never really finding an answer that seemed to fit, or perhaps I got too many answers, all of them somehow falling short. Why do I spend an hour early each morning sitting in the silence? I read some Scripture, but then mostly I sit with the silence. Many are the times when my mind drifts to other times and places and daydreams. Sometimes the silence is scattered with boredom; at other times it stumbles with prayerful words; and sometimes in the silence I look for answers to the plaguing whys of life. Mostly, though, I sit in the silence. I'd like to call it prayer, but then I wonder if I'm simply floundering in wishful thinking. So I return to that haunting question—"What are you looking for?"

I think perhaps the answer is similar to what I look for when I gather with friends. Sometimes the gettogether is engaging, but not always. Sometimes it is memorable, but not always. Sometimes we just hang out, and that can be enough. Ultimately relationships keep me grounded. That also is why I spend time in the silence. It's what I'm looking for when I pray-to be in relationship with God, to be grounded lest I drift away and grow lost.
