December 24, 2023 FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT A message from our pastor Fr. Robert Ni Ni, MF

As we gather on this fourth and final Sunday of Advent, our hearts are filled

Dear Members of our Faith Community,

with anticipation as we await the glorious celebration of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Today, our scripture readings from 2 Samuel and Luke remind us of the importance of being flexible and open to God's plan for our lives, even when it diverges from our own personal plans.

In 2 Samuel 7, we encounter King David, a man who desired to build a house for the Lord, a permanent dwelling place for the Ark of the Covenant. David's intentions were noble and driven by his deep love for God. However, God had a different plan in mind. Through the prophet Nathan, God revealed that David's son would be the one to build the temple. Despite David's initial desire and well-meaning intentions, he humbly accepted

God's plan and adjusted his own personal aspirations accordingly. Similarly, in the Gospel of Luke, we encounter Blessed Mary, a young woman chosen by God to be the mother of Jesus. When the angel Gabriel appeared to her with the astonishing news of her divine calling, Mary was initially startled and unsure, given her own personal plans and expectations for her life. Yet, in an act of profound faith and surrender, she humbly accepted God's plan,

saying, "I am the Lord's servant. May your word to me be fulfilled." Both King David and Blessed Mary teach us the invaluable lesson of flexibility and openness to God's plan, even in the face of our own personal desires and ambitions. They demonstrate the importance of aligning our lives with God's divine purpose, recognizing that His plans are far greater and more extraordinary than anything we could ever envision for ourselves. In our own lives, we often make plans, set goals, and have dreams for our future. While it is important to have aspirations and work towards them, we must hold them with open hands, ready to surrender them if God's plan calls us in a different direction. It requires trust and faith to embrace the unknown, knowing that God's plan is perfect, and His ways are higher than our own.

As we conclude this Advent season and prepare to welcome the Christ child into our hearts and homes, let us reflect on the examples set before us by King David and Blessed Mary. May their stories inspire us to be flexible and open to God's plan in the New Year, even when it challenges our own ideas and expectations. Let us trust that God's plan is rooted in love, wisdom, and a desire for our ultimate good.

May this Christmas be a time of surrendering our personal plans to the divine will of our Heavenly Father.
