## JANUARY 28, 2024 THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TME

A message from our pastor Fr. Robert Ni Ni, MF

#### Hearing Jesus Preach with Authority

This Sunday, the Gospel is set in Capernaum, the hometown of Andrew, Simon Peter, James, and John, the first disciples that Jesus called as apostles. St. Mark explains what happens when Jesus preached in Capernaum's synagogue. When Jesus began to preach, he amazed people by His teaching. Unlike the Scribes who often used their knowledge to judge others, Jesus spoke with authority. Even Satan recognized Jesus in the synagogue at Capernaum. With the voice of authority, Jesus commanded unclean spirits and devils to obey him. This reminds us that the devil is afraid of those who follow Jesus closely, because God's devout followers are difficult for the devil to control.

## Opening Our Hearts to God

Today's psalm urges us to "hear God's voice" and "harden not your hearts." Following Christ requires us to open ourselves fully so we can listen to God speaking and accept God's love and healing power in our midst. Jesus does not promise us that our discipleship journey will be easy all of the time. But if we turn our joys - and our sorrows - to God, we receive God's grace and mercy in return.

## Freeing Ourselves from Anxiety

The Second Reading encourages us to free ourselves of the anxieties of this world so we can follow Jesus without distraction. By centering ourselves on Christ, we are transformed by faith and become God's presence in the world. When we turn our eyes to God, the troubles of this world become easier to manage.

## Praising God & Growing in Faith

God does not need our praise, yet the desire to praise God is a gift in itself. Through worship, prayer, and service to others, we grow in faith. Through faith, we can face the anxieties and challenges of the world with courage and gain the strength to live our vocation and follow Jesus closely.

May God calm our anxieties this week, protect us all from all evil, and guide us in His ways. God bless.

## Understanding the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for people who are very ill, old, or dealing with big health problems. This includes people who are baptized in the Catholic faith and need spiritual strength and grace during their illness.

It can be given before surgery, to elderly people who are very weak, and to sick children who can understand and benefit from it. It can also be given to those who have lost consciousness or the ability to think but would have wanted it. Also, people with serious mental illness who would be strengthened by the sacrament can receive it.

The purpose of this sacrament is to offer a special grace to those going through the difficulties of serious illness or old age. It aims to connect the sick with the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ, providing them with the healing presence and love of the Lord, strengthening their faith, and offering the support of the Church.

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick gives a special grace to the Christian experiencing the difficulties of serious illness or old age. It is best received at the start of serious illness or a setback in old age, and it can be repeated during a prolonged illness or as the elderly struggle with the infirmities of age.

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

We hope this helps to understand the importance of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick for those who are ill or elderly in our community.
