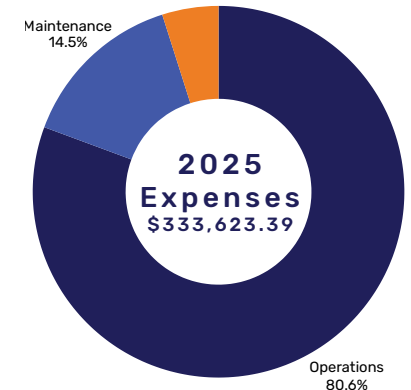
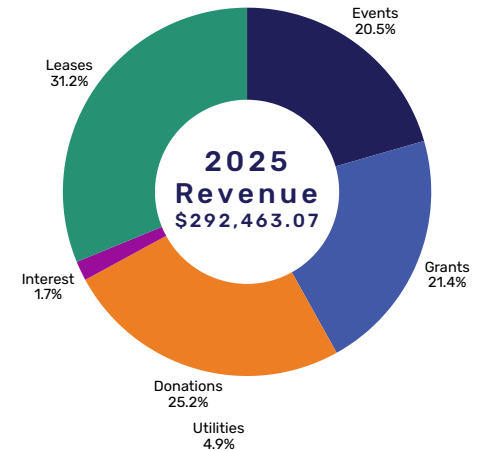
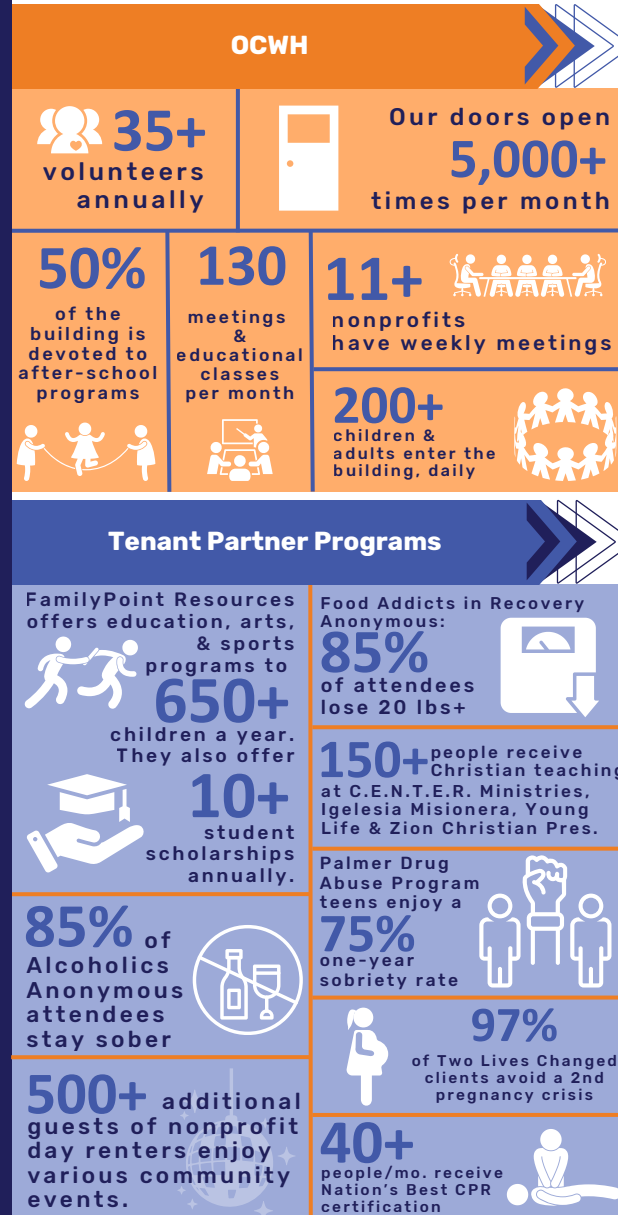
- 65+ ethnicities are represented.
