Pastor's Notes:

This is the time traditionally set for prayer for Christian unity, going from January 18 (last Thursday) to January 25 (this Thursday, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle). Since the Second Vatican Council (1962-65), the emphasis has been one of cooperation rather than contention with our brothers and sisters in Christ (primarily, but not exclusively, Eastern Orthodox and Protestant). The fullness of faith subsists in the Catholic Church, but we have more in common with our fellow Christians than past conflicts and misunderstandings have led us to believe. There are differences in custom and practice, of course, but also real differences in belief in particular questions—some quite serious—but this does not prevent us from acting together in many situations, especially in a world hungry for something which can only be satisfied by the Bread of Life, Jesus Christ. It is in Him that we find unity—a unity that will come only through the grace of the Holy Spirit, not by human efforts alone. It is wrong to say that we cannot cooperate, and it is wrong to say that we are already as one (as in the common expression: "It does not matter what you believe, because we are all going to the same place." As an aside, if we are "going to the same place," it may not be heaven (we may slyly note). "Ecumenism" refers to relations among various Christians, strictly speaking, but, in a broader sense, it helps us in our relationships with what are truly other religions (not based on a belief in Jesus Christ as the Savior)—Jews, Muslims, Hindus, agnostics, atheists, etc. Pray for understanding, reconciliation, and peace, but also remember that Jesus alone is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, from our point of view. We have something good and positive to offer to others, and we should not be shy about "passing it on."

Monday is the 51st anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton, which created a "right" to abortion. Although this was dropped in 2022 (thanks be to God!), there is still much work to do. The bishops' call for "a day of prayer" on January 22 and of "penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion" is still very much a need that we have in our nation. God bless you!
